Our promise and dedication towards completing the Santuario in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the Mysteries of the Rosary perseveres and each day brings us closer to its completion. An illustration of the Dedication Plaques will be presented in the parade for Labor Day to give everyone an image of how they look. The plaques will have a significant placement in the Santuario courtyard as you enter. This phase will begin in the spring of 2024.



This is a picture of the completed mission statue of St. Augustine. The life-size bronze depiction has temporarily been placed at the church in Antonito and will eventually be placed at the Santuario along with six additional mission statues. The process for the next mission statue will begin as entire donations are complete for each figure. We have volunteers actively seeking contributions for the remaining missions of Ortiz, San Rafael, Las Mesitas, San Miguel, and San Antonio.

In addition to the mission statues surrounding the Santuario and the statue of Our Lady Of Guadalupe and St. Juan Diego at the entrance, walkways will lead visitors to various areas of interest. The placement of new trees will also be available to contributors who are interested in dedicating a tree in memory of a family member similar to what now exists on the New Veterans Boulevard entering the Village of Conejos.



We want to acknowledge the generous contributions we have received to keep the project moving along and to local santero Chris Cisneros for his contribution of a beautiful carved depiction of Our Lady of Guadalupe that is on display in the middle of the courtyard. MASS THEME

Theme: Church Management Is Service

Wherever people establish a group, the necessity of management arises. No enterprise can do without it and the executives of any group are human beings, hence subject to human failings, such as jealousy and strife. Furthermore, they will "manage" according to a pattern that they are used to in their own time and culture. The Christian movement came into being in the Roman empire, hence institutionalized itself according to the pattern of which it was a part—Roman law and order. In the feudalistic Middle Ages with its pompous and splendiferous kings, Church management shaped itself automatically after that system. And the Church in the United States is today inclined to manage dioceses and parishes as General Motors manages its enterprise. From the very beginning, the Founder of the Church, the Lord Jesus, had to remind his human coworkers that his movement to establish the kingdom of God on earth should not be managed by human standards alone. Today's Gospel tells us that the twelve apostles had been arguing about who was the most important! Jesus' words to them on this occasion give us an idea of how he envisioned the management of the Church—from the parish council level to the diocesan and as far as the top or Vatican level! The key characteristic of this type of Church management is service. All of us are the Church. All of us should be active in parish activities, but always guided by the desire to serve!

BIBLICAL COMMENTARY

FIRST READING • Wis 2:12, 17-20 • [The Just Are Persecuted]

The setting is the city of Alexandria in Egypt, a port town with a sophisticated Greek culture; the time about 50 B.C. There was a Jewish congregation there, a minority, which because of its own way of life had its opponents. Some Jews tried to find a middle way, compromising between pagan culture and the rules of their Jewish faith; others remained strict and very faithful Jews. This led to friction and even violence. The early Church applied this passage to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, in a very special way. As such, it introduces us to the theme of the Gospel: service and suffering as part of Christian life, if one takes it seriously. If, in serving the congregation, we incur disappointments caused by human strife and jealousy, we should pray with the psalmist: "For the haughty have risen up against me... Behold, God is my helper" (Responsorial Psalm).

SECOND READING • Jas 3:16-4:3 • [Avoiding Conflicts]

James refers to what can happen in any parish organization. Jealousy and strife may be part of it. "You... envy but you cannot obtain; you fight and wage war." Church workers should go by the rules Jesus lays down in today's Gospel.

Psalm 23 Revisited: How We Come Into the House of God BY Jim Elliff

We all love Psalm 23. The image of being shepherded by the Great Shepherd through good and difficult times is comforting for the true believer. The first portion is idyllic. Read it again: The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside quiet waters. He restores my soul; He guides me in the paths of righteousness For His name sake. But the second section brings in the element of danger. Let me make some comments on this portion. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. The original readers and David himself, the author, had an image in mind as he wrote of “the valley of the shadow of death.” For much of the year, the work of the Bethlehemite shepherds took place in the Judean wilderness, just over the Mount of Olives above Jerusalem. At first look, you might think there is no grass in the wilderness at all, but that isn’t so. A good shepherd can find that grass on the right side of the hill, and the running streams for the sheep to drink. But his guidance demands that they work their way through the undulating barren hills of the wilderness. These sharp valleys between the steep banks of the hills demand that the sheep sometimes go through valleys that are dark and foreboding. That would be hard enough, but more than likely the predators were watching above them for the perfect moment to strike. “Evil” may be translated, “evil one,” referring to the enemy of the sheep who would like to destroy them. Yet, because they are with the Shepherd who sees everything, they are at ease, knowing He will protect them. He will use the rod to fend off those predators, and the staff to hook and rescue unwise sheep. They are watched, protected, loved. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you have anointed my head with oil; my cup overflows. This means that the Shepherd leads the sheep to luxuriant grass to provide the nourishment they need. He also pours on the oil that repairs the tears in their



skin due to the thickets and sharp rocks, and even skirmishes with predators. It’s a happy life the sheep has, but still, enemies lurk about. The contrast between satisfaction and fear is dramatic. Surely goodness and loving kindness will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever. Up to death, the believer is protected by this loving Shepherd. God’s goodness and covenant mercy follow him, like ever aware sheep dogs. But then death comes. What is death for the believer? It is entering into the eternal house of God, which the Temple foreshadows. Bethlehem, the city of David’s youth, was a sheep city. It supplied the sheep for the Temple sacrifices. Those sheep entered the physical house of God to be sacrificed on the altar. Throughout the believer’s life in Christ we are shepherded by the Good Shepherd, but death brings the believer into a better place—the perfect world of love—forever.
