THE FIRST LESSON

Ephesians 2:1-10

Here beginneth the 2nd chapter of the letter of the Blessed Apostle Peter to the Ephesians.

THE SECOND LESSON Saint Matthew 10:24-33

Here beginneth the 24th verse of the 10th chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Matthew.

If they have called the master of the house Be-el'zebul, how much more will they malign those of his household. So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. What I tell you in the dark, utter in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim upon the housetops. And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny?
