FEATHERS IN THE WIND

I was talking to Caroline Ertz the other day about our days in Sunday School. We, in Homestead, once met in what we referred to as, "the clubhouse" or as the generation before us would say, "the Marz' Saal."

Somewhere along the line the group of children got moved to "der Grosse Saal" across the street where we stayed until a move was made to South Amana.

Looking back on the history of the community, the congregation was divided into three sections which included a children's section that met in Sunday schools. At the ages of 14/15 one was given an oral exam before the congregation that was done in German until about 1962 when the questions and answers were translated into English, followed later by books in English.

I, being in that first class, remember only too well trying to memorize the commandments in German and praying that I would not be called upon to recite the fourth, the longest commandment of all.

I also remember wondering if God would look on me with disfavor for being so selfish.

Well, as things turned out we were given mimeographed sheets of paper with our questions and answers printed on them which we were to memorize after a lengthy discussion with our teacher, Louis Marz.

We all took a sigh of relief to find out that they were all in ENGLISH and not in German and that complicated "Faktur Schrft" (Ծebente bes Gabbattags baß du ihn heiliget. Remember the Sabbath...)

I was blessed to find that the day of confirmation we were to have it in the High Amana Church, a church I had never been in. Not only that, but it had only one entrance which unfortunately meant that the women's side of the church was on the far side of the room so we had to march in front of everyone always wondering if our shawls were straight or if we looked pious before the congregation.

After sitting through the hymn and prayers the day/moment of reckoning was upon us as the questions came at us fast and seemed without breath a in between.

Naturally, I had counted if I was doomed for the fourth commandment and realized I was safe, but just in case I repeated it to myself in case the poor individual who was "chosen" slipped and needed help... I would become the angel and fly to their rescue while everyone would sigh in adoration. It never happened. After it was over I clomped out of church with my diploma in hand.

I sort of expected some sort of party afterwards, but it was a Sunday like any other Sunday.

My cousin Patricia, had her diploma hung in a gold frame on the bedroom wall. Mine, on the other hand, remained in a drawer.

It's been 61 years since I was confirmed and so many pleasant memories of Sunday School came back to me, but most of all memories of the people.

Our little church had its rules, but you always knew where you were supposed to sit.

To this day I can go up and down the rows of benches and tell you who sat where and how our church was just a little different then the other six. (Homestead had a table in the back for the fore singers and a pump organ by the West wall, in the front.)

Have you ever noticed how the men and women sat on different sides of the church (left or right of the Elder) depending on the church, or how five churches don't face East? (Middle & South do) Lets face it each of the churches is unique, and perhaps someday someone will write a paper about them.



AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Eastern Iowa Hit by Storms

Friday, March 31 was unusually busy weatherwise but predictions for storms and tornado activity actually started Wednesday as the National Weather Service tracked the weather threats. By Thursday afternoon many area schools were announcing an early release for Friday afternoon.

Friday proved warm and yes, by 4 p.m. multiple severe storm warnings were in place for much of eastern lowa.

According to the Iowa County Sheriff's Office which issued a media release on Friday evening, Iowa County was hit by strong winds, measuring up to 70 mph, which did widespread damage to trees, power lines, barns and sheds in the county. A tornado was spotted on the ground near Wellman which caused damage to farm property in the vicinity. Tornado damage was also seen in Coralville.

In the Amanas some roof damage and the loss of small, garden sheds has been reported. One home in Amana sustained roof damage when a tree fell onto the roof. Other reported damage included wind torn garden pergolas, damaged yard lights, downed signs and felled trees especially in Amana and East Amana where it appears the damage was heaviest. Tree limbs were down in all seven cemeteries, with entire pine trees felled in South Amana, High, Middle and Amana. Some cemetery cleanup has already taken place, but volunteers may be needed. Dates and times for

cemetery cleanup may be announced after Holy Week.
