



What to Plant

What to Plant

Annuals/Bedding plants: To add color to the winter garden, plant masses of begonia, impatiens, and geranium. **See** *Annuals*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_annual_landscape_plants

Bulbs: Amaryllis is a popular plant for the holiday season. It can be forced to bloom now or planted outdoors for spring blooms. **See** *Bulbs for Florida*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_bulbous_flowers

Herbs: Plant herbs that thrive in cool weather. Some examples include parsley, thyme, sage, dill, fennel, and cilantro. **See** *Herbs*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic herbs

What to Do

Poinsettias: Enjoy one of the most popular holiday plants. Protect it from cold until spring, and then plant it in the garden for next year. **See***Poinsettias*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic poinsettia

Irrigation: Irrigate if the weather has been warm and dry. Monitor plants for signs of stress and water only as needed. **See** *Landscape Irrigation*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic landscape irrigation

Lawns: Continue monitoring for brown patch and large patch fungal disease until May. Proper cultural practices are key for control. **See***Turf Diseases*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic turf diseases

Houseplants: Inspect regularly for pests on indoor plants. Keep in mind that plant-specific temperature, light, and humidity are key to ensuring that indoor plants thrive. **See** *Houseplants*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic house plants


Soil test: Consider performing a soil test if plants do not perform as desired or if new plantings are planned. **See** *Soil Testing*: http://solutionsforyourlife.ufl.edu/hot_topics/agriculture/soil_testing.html and Landscape and *Soil Test (Home Lawn and Garden)*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_home_soil_testing

Compost/mulch: Use fallen leaves and other plant debris to provide the carbon ingredient needed for successful composting and also to make a good mulch. **See** *Backyard Composting*: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic mulch

Landscape and garden pests: Continue monitoring and treat as needed. While cooler weather generally means fewer pests, some populations actually increase at this time of year. **See** *Landscape Pest*Management: http://edis.ifas.ufl.edu/topic_landscape_pests

HORTICULTURE KNOW HOW...

Annual Poinsettia Handout

1. Poinsettia's are cultivars of Euphorbia pulcherrima, a shrub or small tree native to Mexico and Central America. It was introduced to the US by Joel Poinsett who was the US Minister to Mexico in 1825. It is a member of the spurge family. It is a shrub or small tree growing in seasonal dry forests as understory and grows from 2 to 16 ft. tall. The ones I have seen blooming naturally in the islands and in Mexico were 8 to 10 ft. tall, with long flexible stems with the bracts at the ends. They were in their dry cycle and so had no leaves just bracts. They sort of looked like flying red flowers.



2. Plant care - These are tropical plants. They do not like conditions below 60 degrees, wind, salt, or high variations in soil moisture. They wilt easily and will drop their leaves if subject to high soil moisture variability and hot or cold drafts. They do best in a house if they can get some sunlight every day.



- 3. If given somewhat protected conditions the red bracts can last for weeks. The bracts are actually colored leaves; the flowers are the small yellow or green tufts in the center of the bracts.
- 4. To re-flower or reuse your poinsettia follow these directions: Throughout the winter, keep the plant somewhat dry and do not fertilize until the weather warms in spring. After the weather has begun to warm, cut off the fading bracts, leaving 4-6 inches of the stem on each branch. When new growth begins fertilize lightly, repot if necessary to a slightly larger container. Be sure and use potting mix which drains well. Poinsettias dislike soggy mix. Move the plant to an area with partial shade.
- 5. To use in a shrub border, select a location that is well drained, receives partial sun, and has some wind protection. In addition, if you want consistent flowering, you need to select a location that does not have outside night lighting.
- 6. To encourage re-flowering In July cut the plant back to about 1/2 the height you want for your holiday decorations. On October 1st, begin 14 hours of uninterrupted darkness each night, every night without interruption, and continue this until the holidays arrive. Even a flash of light for a few seconds will interrupt the cycle and delay flowering. Your re-flowered bracts will probably not be as large or as perfect as the commercial ones because you will probably not be providing perfect fertilizer applications nor applying a variety of pesticides.
- 7. Toxicity Despite the rumors, these are not terribly toxic plants. Recent research indicates that it would require the consumption of many pounds of plant materials to produce more than an upset stomach. However, members of the



spurge family have white sticky sap which a small percentage of the population finds to be irritating. So don't eat your poinsettias and when you are working with them keep the sap off of your skin.

Did you know?

The poinsettia is native to Mexico. The ancient Aztecs used poinsettias in their fall celebrations.

Named for Joel Poinsett, the botanist and U.S. Ambassador to Mexico who introduced the plant to the U.S. in 1825.

The colorful and showy "flower" is actually a cluster of modified leaves called bracts. The true flowers are small and clustered in the center of the bracts.

As a result of intensive breeding, there are more than 150 varieties of poinsettias to

POINSETTIA **Pointers**

Caring for Potted Poinsettias

- They do best on a porch or in a window with indirect sunlight for at least 6 hours per day.
- If indoors, room temperatures of 65° 70°F are best; keep them away from cold drafts and excessive heat.
- Water thoroughly only when the surface of the soil is dry to the touch; do not water too frequently.
- Indoors, fertilize lightly only every 4-6 weeks.
- In April, when the leaves and bracts begin to deteriorate and fall off, cut the plant back and give it sun, water and fertilizer regularly.
- A real challenge is to reflower plants indoors the next year. In October, start keeping the plant in complete darkness for at least 13-14 hours each day and in bright light the rest of the day. After about 2 months, your plants will develop a colorful display of holiday blooms.

Poinsettias in the Landscape

- Varieties that naturally bloom in early to mid-November are the best for central and north Florida's landscapes.
- It is best to keep these plants in brighter light during the winter, rather than indoors.
- Plant in early spring as soon as the danger of frost is past. Choose a sunny spot (3-6 hours of sun) that will not receive artificial light at night.
- Cut off fading bracts, leaving 4-6" of the stem on each branch.
- Poinsettias prefer moist, well-drained soils with a pH between 5.5 and 6.5.
- Keep mulched and well-watered until established; fertilize monthly with balanced amounts of nitrogen and potassium, and low phosphorus. Controlled release fertilizers are good.
- Cut back once a month if needed, leaving 4 leaves on shoots; stop pruning in early September.
- Poinsettias are nice in landscape containers, but proper watering is
