
NOVEMBER 11 & 12, 2023 XXXII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME




Today's Gospel is a famous parable that speaks of ten maidens invited to a wedding feast, a symbol of the Kingdom of Heaven and of eternal life (Mt 25:1-13). It is a happy image with which, however, Jesus teaches a truth that calls us into question. In fact, five of those 10 maidens were admitted to the feast because when the bridegroom arrived, they had brought the oil to light their lamps, whereas the other five were left outside because they had been foolish enough not to bring any. What is represented by this "oil", the indispensable prerequisite for being admitted to the nuptial banquet?

St. Augustine (see Discourses 93, 4), and other ancient authors interpreted it as a symbol of love that one cannot purchase but receives as a gift, preserves within one and uses in works. True wisdom is making the most of mortal life in order to do works of mercy, for after death this will no longer be possible. When we are reawoken for the Last Judgement, it will be made on the basis of the love we have shown in our earthly life (see Mt 25:31-46). And this love is a gift of Christ, poured out in us by the Holy Spirit. Those who believe in God-Love bear within them invincible hope, like a lamp to light them on their way through the night beyond death to arrive at the great feast of life. - Benedict XVI

Being a priest is classified as one of the four most difficult professions in the world because a priest must be: a preacher, example, adviser, lecturer, planner, Minister, visionary, director, mentor, friend, babysitter, reconciliatory, marriage, counselor, youth advisor, leader trainer, Bible teacher, intercessor, etc, etc. In addition to being: temple, gatekeeper, brothers' driver, praise leader, the first to arrive and the last to leave.

Every *priest* constantly faces criticisms such as:

- -Mass does not fill me
- -The sermon is very long

One of the most difficult things in the life of a priest (like in Jesus' life) is knowing that the people they love will betray them.

The priest is often the loneliest person in the congregation.

You may see a priest be surrounded by people, but rarely with people who are interested in their problems, needs or even their lives.

And let's not mention the demands that congregations place on *priest*.

For this reason, I would like to give you some advice: if you have a priest or you have priest as friends, take care of them, protect them, pray for them, connect with their vision, support them, but above all, love them.

Jeremiah 3:15 "And I will give you shepherds according to my heart, who will feed you with knowledge and understanding."

So, take care of them because "they watch over your souls as those who must give an account" **Hebrews 13:17.**

Let us honor the lives of all those men of God who have sacrificed so many things including some of their family's needs to attend to God's call.

Value the time that a *priest* dedicates to you, you don't know how much his family would value that time with him.
