The Historic Totah Theater






Laura Harper

Farmington New Mexico TEAM Film Director: Mustang of the Carracas Mesa Documentary

Laura Harper began her journey to learn about the process of humane horse gatherings in 2012 on the Carracas Mesa-Carson National Forest resulting in her adoption of her mustang, Rambo, in 2014. It was during those years 2012 through 2020, she would follow a stallion she later named Cabresto! While filming for Mustang of the Carracas Mesa Documentary, Cabresto and his band would unexpectedly and beautifully appear in the Cabresto Canyon of the Carracas Mesa to star along with her mustang Rambo for her film. The film is funded and donated to this EQUUS Mustang Matinee event by Laura, and it is her passion that a San Juan Basin Mustang haven, preservation and tourist center will be established from the beginning proceeds of this event.

With her love for the mustangs of the Carracas, it is also her hope that no mustang will become a sales-authority-horse and succumb to the travesty of unknown buyers that is too often the case for mustangs over ten-years-old. In collaboration with the Jicarilla Ranger District, Mustang of the Carracas Mesa and Four Corners Equine Rescue, a forever home is waiting for Cabresto and his companion mare, Laura named Paint.

Lisa Diersen is an equestrian; riding since she could sit in a saddle, Diersen has a great appreciation for all types of equestrian disciplines. The EQUUS Film Festival is the first film festival oriented around equestrian-themed content from all over the world that also travels the world. Screening feature films, documentaries, shorts, music videos, commercials, training educational materials, art, and literature, covering all equestrian disciplines, creating a home for the storytellers of the horse world.

Diersen's mission is to show the world how horses can bring everyone together regardless of race, age, gender, abilities, or disabilities. Lisa is passionate about the education and enlightenment of others to the wonderful world of horses and everything they can do to enrich our lives.

Producer and writer credits on the DOWN Syndrome equine documentary "A Pony And His Boy: The Story Of Berry & Josh" for the EQUUS Film Festival in New York City and the National DOWN Syndrome Congress 2019 with SPOTLIGHT Rescue Series partner and film director Julianne Neal. Working on additional SRS documentaries to add to the series she and Neal started in 2017. The Mustang Discovery Ride Project is now in production. Lisa is the Executive Director of the Mustang Discovery Foundation. Adding "The Mustang Summit" to the programming in 2022. With a focus on educating the general public about the American Mustang Horse and its importance in the world today.

She is a published equine author with many articles to her credit. Diersen spent the early part of her career with General Motors in engineering, then moving into the subdivision development and home/barn building market, winning an Illinois Home Builder Award, before returning to her first love...... working with horses! She spends her time, when not promoting equestrian film, having fun promoting Classical Dressage, Lusitano, and Mustang horses, and spending time with her faithful Jack Russell Terrier, Amore, and her Lusitano, Urano.

Abeyta. From the viewpoint of his father, Jose Porfirio, author Victor A. Abeyta, brings to life the people of the Carrizo Community, their friendships and hardships from 1915 to 1937. This is the first SJCHS 30-minute film short oral history with the author of CARRIZO Portrait of a New Mexican Family Jose Porfirio Abeyta and Carmen Sabina Sandoval 1889-1991.

Born in Santa Fe New Mexico, I have been immersed in the multicultural matrix of that magical area since birth. I had to learn how to navigate our modern culture while living with one foot in each world. My childhood clearly illustrated that the well-being of the land and the different peoples living here only comes about when we all understand and work with the full community in all the realms.

My grounding, companion, and guide on my spiritual path is the great and generous spirit of the Horse Clan. I had the great gift of being introduced to horsemanship by a true schoolmaster, a Colonial Spanish colt from the Baroque bloodlines that came to the American Southwest with the first immigrants from Spain. This horse not only taught me to ride High School dressage, he kept me on my feet, literally. Without him, I would have succumbed to the neurological damage I suffered form trauma, heavy metal poisoning, lightning strikes and environmental toxicity.

My series on horsemanship integrates the energetic and mystical aspects of riding with the pragmatic skills of horse handling in the mundane world. Learning how horses move and perceive their world allows us to enter into their realm respectfully. Developing our own body awareness allows us to communicate with horses in a way that they understand. As we humans become aware of our connections with our horse we can also become aware of the living world around us.


Randi A. Samuelson-Brown Author Colorado

Jodie Brenner

Texas Artist

Jodie Brenner is an award winning watercolor and pastel equine artist. Her ability to illuminate the essence and heart of the horse is felt in her paintings and memorial portraits.

She also creates memorial portraits of cats and dogs. When the animal's owner receives the portrait there's a mixture of love, joy, healing and sometimes tears.

Although she started painting with watercolors in 2002, Jodie also has created with mixed media, acrylics and pottery. However, it was in 2019 when she had a pivotal time in her art and life.

She was diagnosed with chronic vestibular migraine and several other vestibular dysfunctions including vertigo, chronic dizziness,

nausea, stabbing head pain and severe cognitive limitations. And she was told there was no cure-she didn't believe them.

It was during this dark time her naturopath suggested she "take the medicine of the horse and paint it".

As a self taught artist she started drawing horses with colored pencil creating meticulous and realistic detail. The slow, meditative strokes of each pencil line applied in multiple layers allowed her brain to become calm and still.

It was the daily practice of creating art and her two Mustangs, Roman and Zaira that literally saved her life and kept her from falling into the abyss of no return. The times when surviving another day seemed unimaginable, it was her horses that carried her back into being. After five years of many dark nights she found a TMJ (Temporomandibular joint) specialist who discovered the custom bite guard made

years prior to prevent grinding actually shifted her jaw out of alignment. A CT scan confirmed the left jaw joint/bone was pushed back and causing disruption to the fragile vestibular system within the inner ear and mixing signals for the brain.

It's been one year since she started working with the TMJ specialist to realign her jaw and release the inflammation, this is allowing her cognitive abilities to heal and once again work in unison with brain and body.

She witnessed the profound healing abilities of the horses through her experiences and trainings as an Equine Facilitated Coach, Equine Bodyworker and Animal Reiki

Teacher. Now she experienced her own transformational healing while navigating through the darkness of chronic vertigo and pain. The amazing gift she discovered along this arduous journey was the re-emergence of her artist shining through in new and different ways. This led her to working with soft pastels and again watercolors to paint the realistic horse paintings she creates today.

The Wild Mare Collection was also born from this journey and aims to be an inspiration and illuminate the profound healing abilities and connection the horses have to offer those that are called to listen. The Collection of the 12 mares is a work in progress and each painting has revealed written messages to pair with the painting.

These paintings along with the written messages will be made into a book and other media that will support mental health and well-being. The horses as sentient beings offer a place of peace and calm which can be felt through Jodie's art.

Through her paintings Jodie's desire is to give opportunity for the horses to be seen and bring inspiration, hope, love, joy and be a shining light for everyone.

New Mexico Wildlife Protection Management PANEL: Mustang Management & Bait Trapping

With a heart for investigation, adventure and to serve. Roch Hart holds a BA in Criminal Justice beginning his career with the Albuquerque Police Department as a police officer and a detective. Today he is the Ranch Manager for Diamond Trail Ranch located in Sandoval County, New Mexico and Founder/CEO of Wildlife Protection Management where he conducts his research with a mission to benefit and protect wildlife in their habitat.

Roch created a system that can send vaccines for disease or birth control to wild animals such as feral/wild horses using a camera system. This system has a future application to broadcast WiFi capabilities to remote locations for controlling water valves, closing gates, reading tags, detecting disease and providing security needed in wildlife as well as in domestic protection management.



Memories of a red Quarter Horse named Rusty, sandstone rocks that mirrored Spanish castles and the Mustangs that roamed the Carracas Mesa-Carson National Forest that surrounded the Fred Bixler ranch created a deep connection with horses and especially a love of the Quarter Horse and the Mustang breeds. Her experiences at the ranch between 1965 and 1970 would forever influence Laura.

Today Laura lives in the Four Corners area with her husband Greg and her Quarter Horses Dusty Dandy, Wendy and her Mustang of the Carracas Mesa, RAMBO. She currently serves as President of the San Juan County Historical Society, Editor of the Four Corners Equine Rescue newsletter publication and serves on the Board of Directors of the Jicarilla Mustang Heritage Alliance




Michael John Leonard

Cowboy, Horseman, Cowboy Poet, Singer and Song Writer New Mexico

Mike was born in the badlands of western North Dakota along the Little Missouri River, an area made famous by our 26th President Theodore Roosevelt. It was, and still is, cowboy country, a land well-suited for Mike, an aspiring cowboy youngster who spent his days emulating the cowboys he saw during the day and dreamed about at night.

Those dreams of the horses became a reality when he married Jicarilla Apache, Bobbie Nell Velarde and from her family learned the ancient oral history of her tribe and their horses.

A life-time of working with horses started my research on Pre-Columbian horses in the Americas.


Shortly after moving to Pagosa Springs, Colorado in the fall of 1978, I met Bob Browning, the iconic Horse Whisperer of San Juan County. I had been a horseback riding instructor since my youth, but it was with Bob Browning where I learned horsemanship through Ray Hunt, John Lions and others. I worked with Bob Browning for 40-years using breed horses and the mustangs to improve attitude in youth of the Navajo Nation and other school, court, church, college, university, FFA, 4H and Boys and Girls club programs.

Special to my journey with horses and my research of them was working alongside Bob Browning in his 1990 initiative to revive the interest of the Appaloosa breed among the youth of the Nez Perce; riding the 1300-mile Chief Joseph Trail Ride where many oral history stories were told.

The Bob Browning Ranch became the number one mustang collection and adoption agency as he partnered with bait-trapper Dan Elkins in a contract with the Jicarilla Forest Ranger District; I had the honor to work with Bob and Dan to support an alternative to menacing all-terrain vehicles and helicopters to round up mustangs. It would be 2013 when Bob Browning and I introduced Laura Harper to Dan Elkins at a local café for her to learn his age-old but, at the time, novel method of bait and trap to be documented in Mustang of the Carracas Mesa.

I continue my research to answer the question Bob and I often entertained that continues to drive me back to the past to find the answer, "What came first in the domestication of the horse?"







Take a young woman with a passion for horses looking for a grand adventure, add American Mustangs and a host of guest riders and you have the ingredients for the "Mustang Discovery Ride." This documentary project tells the story of a journey across the United States on the American Discovery Trail (ADT) featuring Mustang trainer, Lisanne Fear, along with her Mustangs, dogs and (sometimes) a small support team. While the documentary film tells the story of the 14 month cross country adventure, the docuseries follows up on some of the struggles and triumphs that Lisanne and the Mustangs encountered on the trail, most attributed to the kindness of strangers met along the journey. Each 12-episode season features aspects of the ADT in each state, Mustang adoptions inspired by the project, equine programs utilizing Mustangs, Veterans Programs in existence and other Mustang-related stories.


Beyond The Herd

Victor A. Abeyta brings to life the people of the Carrizo Community, their friendships and hardships from 1915 to 1937.

The 30-minute film features Victor A. Abeyta, author of "CARRIZO: Portrait of a New Mexican Family - José Porfirio Abeyta and Carmen Sabina Sandoval, 1889-1991." It brings to life the experience of homesteading in Carrizo Canyon, a major tributary of Largo Canyon southeast of Blanco. The film captures the scenery while Victor Abeyta brings to life the hardships, friendships and history of the Carrizo community as told from the viewpoint of his father José Porfirio Abeyta.





Get The Mind And The Feet Will Follow Directed by: John Saint Ryan Trailer

The film promotes learning about horses, how they think and how they learn, here we align the principles of horse training from Tom Dorrance with Equitation Science. It emphasizes understanding the horse's perspective and covers various training techniques, including combined reinforcement (R+ and R-), classical and operant conditioning, and pressure application, all aimed at keeping the horse in a learning frame of mind. Techniques such as targeting, backing up, moving forward, moving hindquarters, and moving shoulders are detailed with an emphasis on communication, trust-building, and minimizing excessive physical pressure.

We respect Tom's philosophy of understanding horses' motivations and building a partnership is highlighted throughout


HOOVES: Healing America's Veterans Directed by: Josh Nagel 4:00 mins (Trailer Submission)





Mustang of the Carracas Mesa Documentary Directed by: Laura Harper 45:00 mins

More than three years ago, Laura Harper began work on a film script about her once-wild mustang, Rambo. As she delved into his life, she found Rambo's story connected the evolution of the horse to New Mexico's history and her own life here in San Juan County. Laura discovered that the horses used by the Conquistadors more than five hundred years ago to traverse New Mexico had an ancient bloodline that is found here today. Amazingly, a 2013 genetic analysis conducted by Dr. E. Gus Cothran, Department of Veterinary Integrative Bioscience, concluded the Old-World Iberian breed is conclusively a genetic marker present in the Jicarilla mustangs of Northern New Mexico and Rambo's DNA as well. By tracing the mustangs' bloodline, a wonderful history of New Mexico its wild horses and its people— is revealed and vibrantly retold in Laura's film, "RAMBO of the Carracas Mesa: A History of the Jicarilla Mustangs and Mustangers."

The film features local families that represent the diverse culture of Northern New Mexico and their personal relationships with the Jicarilla mustangs. It is through their individual stories that we learn the Jicarilla mustang's historic value to Northern New Mexico's culture. The documentary concludes with the idea that by joining nature, horsemanship, community, science, and technology, there can be a positive future for the mustangs and the approach of the mustangers.





Laura Harper

Laura Harper began her journey to learn about the process of humane horse gatherings in 2012 on the Carracas Mesa-Carson National Forest resulting in her adoption of her mustang, Rambo, in 2014. It was during those years 2012 through 2020, she would follow a stallion she later named Cabresto! While filming for Mustang of the Carracas Mesa Documentary, Cabresto and his band would unexpectedly and beautifully appear in the Cabresto Canyon of the Carracas Mesa to star along with her mustang Rambo for her film. The film is funded and donated to this EQUUS Mustang Matinee event by Laura, and it is her passion that a San Juan Basin Mustang haven, preservation and tourist center will be established from the beginning proceeds of this event.

With her love for the mustangs of the Carracas, it is also her hope that no mustang will become a sales-authority-horse and succumb to the travesty of unknown buyers that is too often the case for mustangs over ten-years-old. In collaboration with the Jicarilla Ranger District, Mustang of the Carracas Mesa and Four Corners Equine Rescue, a forever home is waiting for Cabresto and his companion mare, Laura named Paint.

The Wild Horse Refuge is a private sanctuary that was created entirely for rescued Wild Mustangs that were taken from BLM Herd Management Areas (HMA) located within Colorado. The Wild Horses living on this special property are now protected and have regained the freedom and independence they had prior to government interference.

With more than 29 square miles of contiguous land to run free, their wild and free spirit has been restored. With the Refuge being located just 30 miles from the Sand Wash Basin, the horses feel right at home as they roam freely across the vast open spaces of the Refuge!

There are no paddocks, stock pens, fenced pastures, or other smaller and more restrictive spaces in use here. Instead of being relegated to pens or smaller pastures where they might have an occasional opportunity to run one or two hundred yards - or possibly even a few thousand feet... the wild horses living at the Refuge continue to run until they choose to stop.

It is truly a beautiful sight to see when these wild horses are able to regain control of where they go and what they do completely on their own!

The Wild Horse Refuge is a completely new facility that was acquired in order to create a special home for Colorado's native Wild Horses.

Wild horses (Mustangs) are allowed to roam freely within the Refuge - which has more than 22,500 acres of land for the horses to roam freely.
