BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. Article VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- Destruction of the wicked
- Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Apostolic Faith



"The love of God, is greater far than tongue or pen can ever tell..." O the love of God how truly rich and pure! This past summer God blessed me with the incredible opportunity to spend three months in Balama, Mozambique, Africa, with Brenda Lange and Orphans Unlimited. Words fail me when I attempt to describe how precious it was to witness the love of God changing so many lives. I don't know all the secrets of the Bible or all the symbolic represen-



tations, but I do know, "For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son..." (John 3:16) and sharing this simple message brought light into the eyes of many. I could not verbally communicate except through an interpreter, but the love of God that I had within me was communicated without any problems.

Most of my time was spent helping the ministry in various ways such as processing corn, working in a baby clinic, assisting in food distribution, putting radio programs together, helping cook supper, organizing, various other things, and of course playing soccer. I knew before I left that life was going to be different, but I didn't realize how different. It took me a good month and a half to learn the culture and begin understand the ways of life in Mozambique. Where I was living there were many cultural differences. For example, everyone carries everything on their heads, even the children. Most men proclaimed to be Muslim and most of the women do all the work. Children have a lot of free time and run around the village with no parents, looking for things to do often with a baby strapped on their back. Housing was mud brick with grass roofs and most people only had a few changes of clothes. The differences went from one extreme to the other but, although the people were poor, some had Jesus and that is always more than enough. I spent a lot of the afternoons playing with the children and teenagers.

Never before had I realized the tremendous effect you can have on people just by playing sports with them. I couldn't talk with the children but they could see Jesus in me by the way I played the game. They could see my character and hopefully my relationship with God. Whether it was soccer, jump rope, or hand claps we were able to bond through our time spent together and we quickly became friends. The children are so loving and open to anything. When the younger ones see you coming they run for you and push each other to just get a finger of your hand. The older ones want the love just as much and the minute you single them out and show them love they become your best friends. I had to prove myself to the teenagers but I made good friends with them as well. We started youth nights every Friday and before we left we could see the change in many of their lives. A few of the teenagers who were reluctantly attending Church before were all of the sudden helping us control children and getting involved. It was so exciting to see the love of Jesus shining in

their eyes.

Many people can't believe the sacrifice that I made to spend my summer in Africa, but let me say that I have been blessed beyond measure and do not consider it a sacrifice in any way. God used me and enabled me to be a witness to teenagers and children who were hungry for love and those faces I will not soon forget. I could spend a long time describing how hard I worked in the physical but I would much rather praise God for the work that was done in the spiritual. In the middle of the bush in Africa, God is providing a way for people to hear the Gospel and learn about Jesus and I am so thankful that God gave me the opportunity to be a part of His great plan.



While I was there I taught Vacation Bible School with the help of an interpreter. In the mornings, I taught a Bible school class to anywhere between 100-150 kids of all ages. We sang songs, learned about the Word of God, and made a craft everyday. In the afternoon I worked with some kids from the church to make a



In the group that I went with were two ladies who worked in the clinic that they sat up in the church every day. Over the course of eight days they saw and helped almost 600 people. Every little girl that came was given a pillowcase dress and a handmade doll with the salvation necklace around it's neck and every boy was given at least 1 t-shirt and a toy. They handed out vitamins like they were gold and offered hope to every single one. There was also a team of two men that went out everyday spreading the gospel from hut to hut. One day I went out with them and was able to pray with people personally and see them led to a relationship with the Lord.



For the first week we had revival services every night and one night we packed almost 400 people into the church that was a small one-room building. The pastor at this church was an outstanding man of God who was raised in an orphanage but was put through school by some former missionaries. He had dedicated his life to Christ and was carrying out the burden that God gave him for the people of Haiti. While I was at Mare Rouge I stayed with him and his family in their concrete house and everyone was so gracious to me the entire time.

Although Haiti is a country that was dedicated to Satan, I believe God is doing a great work there and in thousands of lives. I am thankful that I was allowed to have even the smallest part in this work. I feel extremely blessed to have been able to go and share about the God whom I love. Thank you for all of your support! Time To Clean House

I'm becoming increasingly convinced that I need to follow the truth of the admonition of David when he said in Psalm 34 "I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth." For one thing, to bless the Lord means to speak well of Him. I sometimes wonder how well I do in speaking to others about Him. I don't mean just verbally. I mean with my actions (which I've heard speaks louder than words anyway). Do I praise Him continually, which of course includes but is not limited to singing and raising our voices or hand in worship? How do I praise Him? How do I exalt His name?

I've thought much on this. It should be our highest desire to please Him. Are the words of our mouth and the meditations of our heart acceptable unto him? Are we doing what's right because of our motive to find approval by Him? Jesus said that he did always the things that please God. The Word says that Jesus learned obedience by the things which he suffered. It would seem that God places a great deal of emphasis on obedience. We all know this (however this doesn't mean we always do it though). So is there a connection between obedience and praise? Let's consider the "popular" verse that we enjoy hearing the promise of in II Chronicles 7:14, is that He will heal our land, yet look at the conditions for Him doing so. IF those those people....will humble themselves....and turn....(although this word has many definitions, the one I thought most interesting was to slide back). Look what they were to "slide back" from, not to-their wicked ways. Then he will do as He said, but not until. Can it be that a turning from; a forsaking(abandonment)of sin is something that we've forsaken?

Is this part of the reason we pray and sing our songs and go to church and read our Bibles but still lack such power as should be employed by the believer in God... still fail to 'see' His workings? Why are we so reluctant to forsake sin? Does the thought of displeasing God bother us; bother me, less and less as iniquity abounds? Are we repulsed? Disgusted? Offended by sin as much as we preach God is? Do we abstain as iniquity from the very appearance of evil? (maybe that's the problem). Sin doesn't seem to appear as sinful as it once did. Maybe we enjoy "flirting" with it, thinking we can take fire into our bosoms without being burned? Now as we examine II Chronicles there are three things that need to be noted. First, is the direction the priests and Levites were given to sanctify themselves. Secondly, they were to sanctify the House of the Lord and thirdly (and this is the one we want to consecrate on) is the phrase in verse 5.... "and carry forth (to come out of) the filthiness(among other definitions are impurity, immorality, idolatry) out of the Holy Place. The first two could be discussed at length as separate issues but all these tie together. Verses 6 & 7 explain why what they had done to 'earn' the result of verses 8&9. "They have" the Word declares trespassed (acted unfaithfully) and done evil and forsaken(to leave, depart, abandon) God. Those who supposed to be God's chosen had turned their faces from Him- the one who was to be their habitation(Psalm 91:9). They had abandoned Him and because of that the wrath of the Lord was upon Judah and Jerusalem. The Lord delivered them to trouble (maltreatment, agitation), astonishment (ruin, desolation) and to hissing. I like the first four words of verse 9,"then the Levites arose(remember He is speaking to this group in verse 5). Now this is the action- the consecration in reality we teach. Verse 16- the priests went into the inner part of the house of the Lord, to cleanse it and brought out all the uncleaness(defilement) that they found in the temple... and the Levites took it to carry it out. Simple, direct. The foreign objects-things that should not have been in the temple, the trash, and the stuff that was in a place that was supposed to be used for a place of worship.

Now in John 3, Jesus had gone to the feast and finds in the temple (sound familiar) those things that displeased His Father; those things that weren't conducive to the true purpose of His father's house(that it should be called a place of prayer). Verse 15 says that "he drove them all out (carry forth the filthiness) and said take these things hence." Jesus detested the abuse-the irreverence of what he had "found"(to discern, get knowledge of). Of course, we know from scripture that He knows what is in the heart of man; that His find in the temple wasn't anything He didn't know about. Yet His driving out of those things that didn't belong was a visual aid to four groups: His disciples(they remembered Psalm 69), the money changers, the rulers and priests of the temple and the ones that have come to truly worship God.

Now the lesson should be obvious. We, as believers in Jesus, the Son of man and God are to be a dedication-consecrated 'house'. I know that as such, he expects and demands that we,(yes,we) be involved in the cleansing process. If Cor.7:1 has the incredible verse that says, "we ought to cleanse ourselves from all(guess what) filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God". What a great passage! remember in Chronicles it said they found uncleanness when they went in. Does this mean they were unaware of it but with a renewed commitment to God actually did "find" things that were wrong? Or does it mean they knew about the uncleanness but just decided to "let it lay" because it's a hard job to clean something up?

What would Jesus "find" in our lives that shouldn't be there? Perhaps we could ask what would He discover to us-make us aware of-if we weren't so calloused and open to conviction. What have we not 'seen' or is it that maybe we just don't want to 'see'. And after we "find" the filthiness, are we willing to bring it out? Is our house His house-a place where we say that He can reign supreme in, but still have our "stuff" in the way. Are we really willing to surrender it all?

God, help us to clean house.


I voted for the voice of the choir and the congregation to be stilled, and that they no longer sing in united praise.
