GENERAL INFORMATION

- PRE EVENT INFO** For pre-event information or queries, please call Nicholas on 9758 4208 or 0412 175518
- EVENT FORMAT** This event is designed as a motorsport challenge between TCCA, RSOCV, FFCC and NCCA for new and existing motorsport competitors and a range of skill levels. It will consist of:
- A Touring Road event from Officer to Haunted Hills track,
 - A bitumen Motorkhana, and
 - A Hillclimb.
- Competitors may enter any, or all three portions of the event.
- EVENT RESTRICTIONS** This event is only open to financial members of TCCA, RSOCVic, NCCA and FFCC, or by direct invitation by the event organizers only. A quarter the entry number is reserved for each club – so entries are strictly limited. Pre-entry is mandatory as no entries will be taken on the day of the event. If insufficient entries are received 1 week prior to entry, entries may be opened to other clubs – so get your entries in early...
- ENTRIES** Entries for this event should be sent C/O Entries Secretary via email to daleandkate0379@gmail.com or by post to 8 Acer Terrace, Hoppers Crossing 3029, Victoria
Cash payment for entries will not be accepted by post, please contact event administration to make payment arrangements. Cheques are to be made out to the **Toyota Car Club Australia Victoria**. Entries must be accompanied by the signed disclaimer, self scrutiny form and evidence of both Club Membership and Motorsport Australia Licence. Licences will be available on the day at the event.
Up to 4 adults and any number of juniors may compete in any car, provided that this is indicated on the entry form.
- TOURING ROAD EVENT** This will be a 2 – 2 ½hr drive to the Haunted Hills track. Meeting point will be the BP outbound service station on the Monash Freeway at Officer (between Berwick and Pakenham) at 7am on Saturday 24th April 2021. Competitors will be divided up into teams consisting of those in each car (1 car = 1 team). Instructions will be issued to each team with sealed instructions and sent off at 1 minute intervals. This portion of the event is open public roads and all Road Rules MUST be adhered to. The route will need to be navigated by each team with a series of questions that need to be answered by travelling along the prescribed route. The "route" will be approx. 140km in length and will be suitable for cars towing racecar trailers and fully on sealed roads. Answers will be checked to determine a team winner.
- MOTORKHANA** The bitumen Motorkhana will be held in the Haunted Hills Hillclimb car park in Bill Shultz Road, Yallourn. Book in for competitors will be from 10:45am upon arriving at the venue which is the finishing point for the Touring Road Event. The Motorkhana will commence immediately following a driver briefing at 12noon. Test sheets will be provided upon book in. The Motorkhana is expected to finish around 5pm.
- DINNER** Dinner will be at The Morwell Hotel at 311-327 Princes Dve, 3840 Morwell, Australia. Dinner and sharing stories from the day will start from 6:30pm. Confirmation of attendance at the dinner should be provided to Maurie via SMS on 0418 357360 before 6pm Wednesday 21ST April 2021. Please remember that if competing the following day - a zero alcohol BAC is applicable on Sunday – so no excessive alcohol consumption on Saturday night.
- ACCOMODATION** Competitors must organize their own accommodation if staying locally. Accommodation is available in Morwell or Moe as well as surrounding towns. Accommodation at the Morwell Hotel (5134 1355) starts from around \$75 for a single for the night (Same venue as Sat night dinner). Camping is also available at the track – please book with Maurie via SMS on 0418 357360 before 6pm Wednesday 21ST April 2021
- HILLCLIMB** On Sunday 25th April 2021 a Hillclimb will be held at the Haunted Hills GCCs ground at Bill Shultz Road, Yallourn. Book in and scrutiny will be held from 9am with competition starting immediately following drivers briefing at 10am. Competitors should try to arrive around 8:30-9am at the venue) Multiple runs will be held on the track during the day, with competition expected to cease around 4:30pm.

DRIVERS

New drivers are welcome / **encouraged to come** to and join in the event as it is aimed at catering for novice competitors who have not competed previously. Level 1 (single event) and Level 2 (annual) licences will be available at the event for both the Motorkhana and Hillclimb.

Drivers in the Touring Road portion of the event must be suitably licenced to drive on public roads in Victoria.

Drivers in the Motorkhana portion of the event must be 12yo and older and have a Motorsport Australia Speed or Speed Junior licence as a minimum. A single passenger / instructor may be taken in the Motorkhana portion of the event, providing they have signed the appropriate disclaimer.

Drivers in the Hillclimb portion of the event must be 14yo and older and have a Motorsport Speed or Speed Junior licence as a minimum. Inexperienced junior drivers will need to demonstrate suitable car control (in the Motorkhana) and have an experienced licenced adult as an instructor for the Hillclimb portion of the event. Drivers in the Hillclimb portion of the event must wear ankle to wrist non-flammable clothing and a helmet while competing.

PASSENGERS

Passengers are welcome / encouraged to come to and join in the event as it is aimed at catering for novices who have not competed previously.

There are no restrictions on passengers in the Touring Road portion of the event however all road rules must be followed.

A single passenger in the Motorkhana portion of the event will be permitted and must be 12yo and older, providing they have signed the appropriate disclaimer.

No passengers will be allowed in the competitive Hillclimb component of the event.

VEHICLES

Any road car and most types of competition cars are suitable for this event. Specific competition cars or modifications are NOT required and road tyres should be utilized with most road cars eminently suitable for this event. Vehicles will be checked for safety before the Motorkhana and Hillclimb portions of the events, and can be registered, unregistered, club permit or specially constructed vehicles.

All vehicles should

- be empty of loose items in the cabin and boot,
- have steering and suspension components in good condition with no play,
- have seatbelts and seats in good condition and securely mounted,
- have the battery securely fastened,
- and be in generally sound condition.

For the Hillclimb - an AS compliant fire extinguisher (*dated within 3 years*) must be provided and securely fixed (*by high tensile bolts*) within reach of the driver. Additionally in the Hillclimb, a battery triangle must be provided on the external bodywork of the vehicle (*may be in temporary blue tape*) near the battery.

Please check your vehicles yourselves PRIOR to the event. If unsure of compliance / requirements, please contact either of the event directors for guidance.

It is anticipated that amongst the classes (*TBD based on entry numbers / vehicle types*) will be a "Road Warrior" class. The class is specifically designed for normal road cars and will have 3 basic requirements – that the vehicle is driven to and from the event, competes in all three components of the event, and that the same tyres are used for the whole weekend.

ASSISTANCE

Assistance and guidance can be provided at any time throughout the weekend from experienced competitors by asking one of the event officials. Experienced competitors are also on hand and willing to take passengers in the Motorkhana and provide tips to provide guidance as requested. Guidance for both adults and juniors is available. Each Club Team will have a nominated Team Leader (TBD).

CATERING/ FACILITIES Toilets are available at the Haunted Hillclimb track venue. (*A toilet stop is included approx. ¾ of the way through the Touring Road event too*) Food, drink will be available at the venue as GCC will be running a Canteen at the track during both Saturday and Sunday portions of the event.

CLUB TEAM COMPETITION This event is designed as a motorsport challenge between RSOCVic, TCCA, NCCA and FFCC. It is designed to be a friendly competition with club vs club for the event (in a similar manor to the 2019 TCCA vs RSOCV TB Motorsport weekend – where a few FFCC and NCCA members bolstered the RSOCV and TCCA teams in 2019). Every competitor / car shall be allocated a team (RSOCVic or TCCA) based upon origin club and car to be driven at the directors discretion. The teams will generally be of even numbers to balance the club competition. For each of the 3 event disciplines throughout the weekend, a winning club will be determined based upon the best 6 results in class for each club team. The club competition for each component is scored 4, 3, 2, 1. The winning club will be the club with the most (cumulative) points for all three event disciplines.

ALTERNATE SUNDAY MEETING / CRUISE For those people attending only the Sunday portion of the event or intending to spectate on the Sunday, a cruise down to the venue is being organized. . Meeting point will be the BP outbound service station on the Monash Freeway at Officer (between Berwick and Pakenham) at 7:30am for an 7:45am departure am on Sunday 14th April 2019. People meeting for the freeway cruise to the venue should meet outside the McDonalds entrance. (Please note that the event organizers will NOT be at this meeting point, and attendees need to organize themselves to leave at 7:45am in order to arrive at the venue at 8:45 - 9am. The trip is 90km long and should take 60 minutes.

Vehicle Requirements	Vehicles will need to be checked by the entrant for safety prior to the event. Vehicles however may be re-scrutineered at the discretion of officials at the event, subject to Covid19 requirements. General Requirements for Cars & Drivers – Schedule A (Motorkhana) and Schedules A & B (Hillclimb) Slick racing tyres may be utilised, however a compliant roll cage complying with Schedule J of the current Motorsport Australia Manual must be present in that vehicle. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia. A fire extinguisher complying with AS1841 and be securely mounted with HT bolts within reach of the driver for the Hillclimb portion of the event.												
Apparel	All apparel including helmet shall comply with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport. A Helmet and long sleeve shirts and pants are required by competitors when competing in the Hillclimb.												
Classes / Categories	To be determined based upon entries received. However a “Road Warrior” class however is anticipated where entrants will need to drive the vehicle to and from the event as well as compete / drive the whole weekend on the same set of (road legal) tyres.												
Document Verification and Vehicle Scrutiny	Verification of relevant Motorsport Australia Licence will be undertaken by the organisers on Friday 23 rd April 2021. Competitors with new (recent) licences should scan a copy of their licence receipt from Motorsport Australia as proof of a recent licence application. New licences and Introductory Licences will be available at the event. Please contact the event directors for clarification if in doubt PRIOR to the event. Membership of a current Motorsport Australia Car Club Membership will be required to be scanned and sent in with your event entry for this event – current as of 24/25 April 2021. Vehicles will need to be checked by the entrant for safety prior to the event. Please see the attached checklist to be completed, scanned and sent back to the event organiser prior to 6pm Thursday 22 nd April 2021. Drivers of vehicles with a log book must present that log book to the scrutineer at the event.												
Event Conditions	Individual event results shall be determined by the lowest aggregate of elapsed times on the tests completed, plus any penalties. Results for the combined event will comprise of a points system for each of the three events totalled.

If time permits a non-timed / non-competitive session may be run where a single passenger will be allowed in the Hillclimb portion of the event providing they are over 14yo and have signed the Passenger Ride Entry form.</p> <p>Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. - motor vehicles (or parts of them) colliding with other motor vehicles or persons or property;
- other participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills;
- high levels of noise exposure;
- acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
- the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

Exclusion of Liability, Release and Indemnity

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motorsport Activities, I agree:

- to **release** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - my **death**;
 - any **physical or mental injury** (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
 - the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a **disease**;
 - the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other **condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or state of affairs**:
 - that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
 - that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,
 - howsoever arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities;
- to **indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at my own risk.

I understand that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;
- nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded, however the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law;
- nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and
- Motorsport Australia has arranged for limited personal injury insurance coverage which may provide me with some protection for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities. I acknowledge and accept that the insurance taken out by Motorsport Australia may not provide me with full indemnity for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities, and that I may have to pay the excess if a Claim is made under an insurance policy on my behalf. I agree that my own insurance arrangements are ultimately my responsibility and I will arrange any additional coverage at my expense after taking into account Motorsport Australia's insurance arrangements, this document and my own circumstances.

Where Motorsport Activities are held in the following jurisdictions, I acknowledge that I have also read and accept the following warnings:

Under the Australian Government Consumer Law (which is part of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Commonwealth)), several guarantees are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. You agree that the application of all or any of the provisions of Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3-2 of the Australian Consumer Law (i.e. guarantees relating to the supply of services), the exercise of rights conferred by those provisions, and an liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities for a failure to comply with any such guarantees, are excluded. - are reasonably fit for any purpose which you either expressly or by implication, make known to the supplier; and
- might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 22 of the **Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 (Vic)**, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you.  - is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
