Matthew 3:2 "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near."

In Canton I used to attend a weekly lectionary study. One day during this study a man named Kevin who was the Associate at First Baptist said, "My dad is a manly man. He hunts, skins deer, and works the land. Until recently I had only seen him cry twice, once at my grandfather's funeral and once at my mom's funeral. However, recently I have noticed a change in him. He cries every time he watches a Hallmark Christmas Movie."

Have you ever seen the Hallmark Christmas movies? I have to tell you the DVR at the Christy house is chock full of them right now. The good news is, if you have seen one, you have seen them all. I think they use the same plot in each movie. It goes something like this. There is a guy who swears he will never be in a relationship, but then he comes into contact with a girl and he changes a little for her. Then he creates a problem. He runs away leaving her stranded near Christmas. Then something changes in his heart. He goes and finds her, either at the Airport terminal or the local coffee shop, I don't remember which. He tells her how bad he has been and he completely changes. They live happily ever after. If you have seen one, then you know that is the plot.

Now Kevin brought up something that I found fascinating. In these movies, the climatic scene is always built around a great moment of repentance. It is not just Hallmark that does this though. I think that is true in a lot of our Christmas stories. In the Grinch, when the Grinch hears all the who's singing his heart, it grows three sizes and he brings back Christmas to the town. He repents and reorients his life. He changes. In the Christmas Carol, Ebenezer Scrooge has an encounter with the ghosts and ends up changing his life.

Repentance, it seems to me, is something that we associate culturally with the Christmas season. However, in the church, repentance is not something that we typically think of when we think of Christmas. Oh we think of the Nativity, we think of the wise men, we think of a baby born to a virgin mother and a scared father, but repentance? That seems more like a Lent theme, doesn't it? Repentance doesn't really seem to fit within our Christmas narrative.

I wonder why that is. Why isn't repentance one of the first things we think of when we think of Advent? Why does Hallmark do a better job embodying repentance than the church does during this Christmas season? Well, I think John will help us understand that a little bit. You see, repentance isn't simply a high churchy word. Repentance is a way of life; and, if we are to walk the disciples' path, it is crucial for us to embody repentance day in and day out.

In our Scripture this month we traveled out to the wilderness to hear a sermon from that desert prophet John the Baptist. The message that we hear coming from John is decidedly different from the other

messages of his day and time. John shouts out in the wilderness, "Repent for the kingdom of heaven has come near." The first word that we hear from John sounds an awful lot like the first word that we hear from the bullhorn of street preachers, "Repent!"

Of course when John says "Repent," he isn't using repentance as we so often do. When we use the word repentance, we are typically referring to a vague feeling of sorrow that we have when we get caught doing something wrong. Repentance tends to be more associated with feelings than it does with action.

When John says, "Repent," he is calling the people to action. He is calling people to change their lives by turning all the way around from their old ways. He is calling the people to embrace a new life. He is not calling the people who come out to hear him in the wilderness to sacrifice an animal; he is calling them to lives of personal sacrifice. For John the act of baptism seals this transition. Once you have decided that you will indeed repent, you confess your sin. John grabs you and dunks you in the Jordan, and when you are raised up, you are a new creation.

John tells these Pharisees and Sadducees, "Do not presume to say to yourselves we have Abraham as an ancestor, for I tell you, God is able to raise up children for Abraham from these stones." It is easy to remove ourselves from this story and think that John is only talking to the Pharisees and Sadducees here, but that is not the case. John, out in the wilderness, is calling you and calling me to repentance. The Pharisees and Sadducees described themselves as a kind of works righteousness. They felt that they could be made holy by the things that they do. John calls them to repent of their sanctimonious self-righteousness in order that they may be humble servants of God. Somehow though I don't think John is only speaking to the Pharisees and Sadducees.

Oh it is easy to think that we are nothing like the Pharisees and Sadducees, but chances are we are more like them than we would ever want to admit. There are all kinds of things that we put our hope in or we put our trust in before we place them in God. We may not be running out and shouting, "I have Abraham as a Father; I can do whatever I want." We are more likely to say, "I read my bible every day. I pray every day. I go to church. I help people when I can. Surely I am good. Surely I am saved." Each and every one of those things is good. They are vitally important to our formation as Christians, but they do not save us.

If we only place our hope and our trust for salvation in our abilities and in our good works, we have missed the point. Salvation does not come to us because of anything that we do. Salvation comes to us in the form of a baby, lying in a manger, and as Martin Luther said, "The wood of the cross and the wood of the manger are the same." In order for us to embrace the life that Jesus Christ calls us to, we must repent. We must know that we need a savior, but we must also structure our lives around repentance. Because the second that we stop repenting, the second that we stop trying to grow into the grace that God freely gives us, we start moving backwards.

In this season of Advent, in this season of busyness, let us take a few moments. Let us repent, repent of our sins, repent of our transgressions, and repent of our busyness. Let us be stopped in our tracks by the grace of God, and may we linger in the wilderness just for a few moments, and may we listen to that wild, locust eating, camel hair dressing preacher, John the Baptist. He knows something we need to hear. He knows God's grace and God's peace flow from a manger. May we be humbled by that grace, and may we walk out into the world as a people ready and willing to repent. In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
