New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

*Sick & Shut-ins:* The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

*Marriages:* In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

I feel warm and happy inside as I begin this reflection, for no particular reason, really. It has been a hectic May: and June is not going to be any less exciting either. Stressful moments have

Now it dawns on me why I feel warm and happy inside. I wish that many more Catholics will come to realize what a treasure we have at our disposal. With such a great gift and energy booster, how won't I be able to face the joyful and sorrowful stresses that daily life throws at me. I hope you too find strength in what we celebrate and receive - Corpus Christi.


# FIRST COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION CLASSES
