The Joseph P. Jacques Scholarship program was funded through the generosity of Joe's wife and our current club president, Maria Jacques. Her gift will allow our club to offer scholarships to Brown County high school seniors for many years to come.

Joe was a past club president and our most active, creative, and passionate member. He was born in Menominee, Michigan and graduated from the University of Michigan in 1989 with a degree in Communications. He was an ardent Wolverines fan and often came to our Monday noon meetings with stories about spending the weekend following their football and basketball teams all over the country. Joe loved to take road trips and was known to impulsively say to his five kids "who wants to take a ride with me"? The lucky child could end up anywhere from Manitowoc to Seattle.

Joe was a Vice President and Wealth Management Advisor at Merrill Lynch for 20 years. He loved serving his community and led his family in volunteering with numerous Green Bay organizations. His sister jokingly called Joe "The Mayor of Green Bay" because it seemed he was friends with every person in town. His kindness and generosity are legendary, and anyone who knew Joe was touched by his caring, giving ways.

In May, 2019, we shockingly lost Joe and his beautiful daughter Brie, a sophomore at Ashwaubenon High School, in a tragic accident. While family and club members continue to mourn their loss, we are also proud to honor their memories with these college scholarships.

The Downtown Green Bay Kiwanis Club encourages this year's recipients to follow the examples set by Joe and Brie, and find time to work with youth and those less fortunate during their busy college days.
