## Preparations Underway for Annual Mullet Festival

Members of the Optimist Club of Perdido Bay are gearing up for their biggest project of the year, the Annual Mullet Festival on Labor Day at the Lillian Community Club.

The day begins with breakfast, followed by the 5K run and walk, mullet toss, silent auction and déjà vu market, mullet/catfish/ham lunch, music, raffle, craft vendors, bake sale, bloodmobile and more.

Start the fun with the famous Optimist breakfast that is served from 7 to 9 a.m. \$4 will get you eggs, sausage, pancakes, grits, biscuits and gravy, fruit and beverage. Kids under 8 years of age eat free.

American Legion Post 48 members will raise the flag in an awe-inspiring presentation at 7:15 a.m., with the race stepping off at 7:30. Awards will be presented in several age groups for the runners and walkers. The 1-mile fun run starts at 8:30. To sign up for the race visit <https://secure.qgiv.com/event/3amf/>. Registration on the day of the race begins at 6 a.m.

The kids' fun station opens at 9:30 a.m. and remains until 2 p.m. Men, women, boys and girls will be competing in the mullet toss from 10 a.m. to noon. Awards will be given in several categories.

Gently used items of all kinds will be available for sale in the déjà vu market from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Stop by the silent auction tables to bid on a variety of items including

tools, household items and gift certificates for everything from dinners to haircuts and beyond.

There's nothing better for lunch than the Optimist Club special mullet/catfish dinner that includes hush puppies, baked beans, grits, coleslaw, dessert and beverage. Don't like fish? Ham is also available for you. Cost is \$10 per person, but once again, kids under 8 eat free.

Big Jake and the Tag-A-Longs will provide music for listening and dancing from noon to 3 p.m. The raffle drawing will be held at 3 p.m. Tickets are \$1 each or six for \$5. Prizes are \$1,000, \$400, \$200 and \$100.

All proceeds from the event will be used to fund programs to "Bring Out the Best in Kids." Throughout the school year, Optimist members work with Elberta and Foley schools on a variety of projects including reading, math tutoring, mentoring, providing Christmas gifts for special needs classes and donations to local organizations that help those in need.

The club provides scholarships to high school seniors and for students to attend the National Flight Academy aboard NAS Pensacola.

A fishing rodeo, Easter egg hunt and breakfast with Santa are also on the Optimist Club of Perdido Bay agenda. Join us at the Mullet Festival and be a part of the Optimist Club mission.





## New Priest Welcomed at Lillian Church

When Fr. James Singarayyar was in the sixth grade he knew he wanted to become a priest. In June he arrived at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Lillian as pastor to guide the community in their everyday lives as Christians, fulfilling his childhood dream.

After completing his regular studies in his home state of Tamil Nadu, India, Fr. James joined the Heralds of Good News in 2009. He served as the Dean of Philosophy at the Formation House of the order. In July 2016 he arrived in the United States to join St. Ignatius parish in Mobile.

He says his goal is to build a community "with the grace of God and help of the people." He wants to bring all members of the parish to

participate in all ministries. "I want to know all the parishioners individually," he said.

The Good Samaritan gospel recently tied in with his goal for the parish. The stranger took care of the injured man and then worked with others to see that he continued to receive help. Father called it "networking." He explained how the congregation can work together for the good of all.

Fr. James started his mission at St. Joseph with a reception after being installed as pastor by Mobile Archbishop Thomas J. Rodi. He continues as he visits with members of the Parish Council, Altar Society and other parish groups so that all phases of the church community may work together for the good of the parish and each other.



Women with Clear Vision has announced the grand opening of their new thrift store in Lillian.

The Our Second Vision store is located at 34463 Hwy 98, Unit I. This is in the Lillian Shopping Center that also houses Pelican's Nest and Lillian Medical Clinic. The inventory will continually change but will typically include men's, women's and children's clothing, housewares, appliances and decorative items.

Women with Clear Vision has a women's shelter in Pensacola. Housing services are provided for emergency, short-term and permanent situations for single women and women with children. Personal development service programs are also available.

The phone number for the store is (251) 961-2300 with hours of operation of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 8 a.m. to


6 p.m. Saturday.

All proceeds from the shop help fund the group's shelter and their 90-day program.

A goal is to reduce recidivism in regards to homelessness, and help clients reach autonomy by empowering them with the knowledge and skills to live within the community prepared for life challenges, and to be productive citizens and individuals within their own lives.



## States with Happiest Residents

Ever wish you felt happier? I certainly do. Obviously a lot of us wish we felt happier because a Gallup poll found the subject intriguing enough to conduct a happiness survey. In 2016, Dan Witters, research director of the Gallup-Healthways Well-Being Index, set out to discover which American states had the happiest residents.

To compile his data, Witters asked residents of all 50 states five questions: Do you like where you live? Do you like what you do each day? Do you have loving relationships? Are you managing your economic situation in a way that reduces stress? How are your health and energy levels?

Witters' research revealed that people who live in Hawaii are happier than persons who live in the other 49 states. The conclusion was no surprise; Hawaii has finished number one in the Gallup happiness poll five times since 2008.

The reason for Hawaii's first place ranking was summed up by two residents. Danny Quan, owner of a taxi cab company, states, "Even if you wake up sad, you can go to the beach or enjoy the mountains or go hiking." Kent Terada, a respiratory therapist, visits the beach two days a week. Terada surfs, goes for a run, grabs a bite to eat, then finds a shady tree and strums his ukulele.

Coming in second to Hawaii was Alaska. Like Hawaiians, Alaskans enjoy the outdoor opportunities their state affords. Instead of surfing, Alaskans spend their happiness hours engaged in activities friendly to their cold-weather climate such as fishing, hunting and cross-country

skiing. Alexis Will, a Fairbanks resident, said exercise is important to Alaskans. "People here aren't timid about going outside no matter what the weather, and that gives us a good sense of self and place."

The states taking the next three spots were Montana, Colorado and Wyoming. The survey listed the bottom five, or unhappiest, states as Indiana, Ohio, Oklahoma, Kentucky and West Virginia. Kentucky has ranked 49th in happiness for the last seven years.

The survey caught my attention because I'm a Kentucky resident, and Kentucky is a severe state in which to live.

The winters in Kentucky are marked by rain, snow, ice and gray skies. When winter rolls around, I recall the sugar-white beaches on Perdido Key and my daily walks around the Lillian Recreational Park when I lived in Lillian. There are times when I consider returning to the gulf coast.

The survey is important because it reminds us that happiness is vital to our well-being. The survey encourages us to ask ourselves, "How happy am I?"

If we find ourselves chronically unhappy, it's up to us to do something about it. Our happiness is our responsibility; no one can make us happy. I wish us all the best in our quest for a happy life.



## Sirens of the Sea Annual Drawdown Fundraiser


