CIWI Sponsors, Key Stakeholders, and Supporters.

With yet another successful year under our belt, CIWI continues to hold closely to our core mission...to provide "Access+Exposure+Opportunities" for lower-income college students (majority first generation) with an interest in Construction, Real Estate Development, Architecture & Engineering and Civic Engagement.

Key Accomplishments and Milestones (2012-2018):

- CIWI has delivered 72 internships, including 50% to young women and 50% to young men;
- 100 percent of the internships have gone to students of color; and
- CIWI has designed and implemented several innovative initiatives, including:
 - *Innovative and Multi-Year Partnership with SF PUC.* Since 2016, CIWI has designed and implemented an innovative *LEED and Sustainability* program, delivering approximately 20 hours of targeted training, guest speaker presentations, and building site tours to gain greater access and exposure to the industry, including best practices and trends.
 - *Placements with Affordable Housing Developers.* Over the last three years, CIWI has placed several interns with affordable housing developers, general contractors, and industry intermediaries. Most recently (and based on funding from JR Cahill Fund, Lendlease, and John Stewart Co.), CIWI has been able to underwrite several intern placements, including with Mercy Housing (at the HOPE SF Sunnydale site) and with Bridge Housing Corporation (at RAD project sites). As well, Enterprise Community Partners joined the CIWI family in 2018 as both funder and key member in our *Affordable Housing Initiative*.
 - Bay Area Trends: Economic and Housing Development. CIWI is committed to introducing our interns to industry key stakeholders and leaders in addition to Bay Area trends. As such, SF HAC (HAC) and SPUR are key industry allies. For the last three years, HAC has presented its Housing 101 Presentation, including a very lively Q&A following the presentation. As well, CIWI interns have attended the last several SPUR Membership Events (in SF and Oakland) to meet and brainstorm with industry practitioners, to understand the role of SPUR, and to develop their personal and networking skills.

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











Internships: By Discipline/Scope, 2012-2018




CIWI INTERNS: BY THE NUMBERS

In partnership with our Community Based Partners, CIWI has created targeted and grass-roots outreach programs to maximize our engagement with a diverse group of young adults. As well, CIWI has developed its annual program to achieve realistic and sustainable growth.




Community Based Partners

CIWI has established strong partnerships with grass-roots partners including College Track, City College San Francisco (Ocean Avenue), and Juma Ventures. In Oakland, we partner with East Bay College Fund and Lighthouse Community Charter HS, based in East Oakland.



Ethnicity

100 percent of our 72 internships have been secured by students of color. CIWI has achieved strong diversity over our first seven years by designing specific outreach strategies to maximize our efforts in our core markets, including San Francisco's D10 and in Oakland's Central and East Oakland communities.



Gender

Working closely with our key CBO partners, CIWI has achieved gender equity (50/50) in our placements, with 36 internships secured by young women and 36 internships secured by young men.

	 Civic Engagement/Leadership Development Scope: A series of civic engagement events with key industry stakeholders, averaging 30 hours of community and economic development exposure over the 12-week period. 2018 program events included: SFPUC/LEED+Sustainable Infrastructure Program (L+SIP). In partnership with SFPUC, CIWI developed L+SIP to provide our interns with a solid understanding of the following:





Over the last three years, CIWI has designed and implemented our innovative Civic Engagement program in partnership with the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SF PUC). As well, CIWI is a community-based program that has secured three years of funding through the PUC's Project Learning Grant (PLG) program.

With PUC funding, CIWI created its LEED+Sustainable Infrastructure Program (L+SIP), an innovative program that focuses on project-based learning model to provide greater awareness, access and exposure to the Environmental/Sustainability world.

Without a doubt, L+SIP has partnered with several firms and other key stakeholders that are industry leaders as it relates to understanding best practices/industry trends regarding sustainability, LEED and related programs, new technology, and local Bay Area developments that are on the cutting edge of incorporating new best practices to address building, environment, and community issues.

Core scope included:

- Project Specific LEED training + Sustainability Analysis + Due Diligence;
- Participated in five workshops targeted to Sustainability and Systems; and
- Attended USGBC's Greenerbuilder conference at UCSF Mission Bay (San Francisco, CA)




















In 2018, CIWI jumped into San Francisco's *Affordable Housing and Community Development* arena by underwriting four CIWI interns placed with some of the Bay Area's most active and committed affordable housing developers and intermediaries, including John Stewart Company, Bridge Housing Corporation, Mercy Housing, and our newest affordable housing partner, Enterprise Community Partners.

This summer, our interns worked on several affordable housing developments including HOPE SF and RAD developments. In prior years, we have placed interns that have worked on Ping Yuen (with Cahill Contractors). Event guest speakers have included Margaret Miller (JSCo) and Anne Tourney (Mithun/Solomon), who provided a fantastic overview of the Hunters View HOPE SF program and goals.







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
CCSF Workshop. October 2018.

CIWI has been collaborating with City College of San Francisco (Ocean Ave.), with an emphasis on its Architecture, Interior Design, and Construction Management Department since 2017.

To date, CIWI has participated in two CCSF/Internship Events to ensure that CCSF students are aware of CIWI—including program, goals, and schedule. As well, CIWI is exploring ways to maximize its commitment to CCSF college students interested in gaining "Access+Exposure+Opportunities" in the AEC industry –including technical skill, personal and professional development.

Since inception, CIWI has developed internship placements for several CCSF students. As well, we have worked with CCSF students, seeking to transfer and pursue four-year degrees, intern with CIWI—and then have more insight to education and career opportunities.






