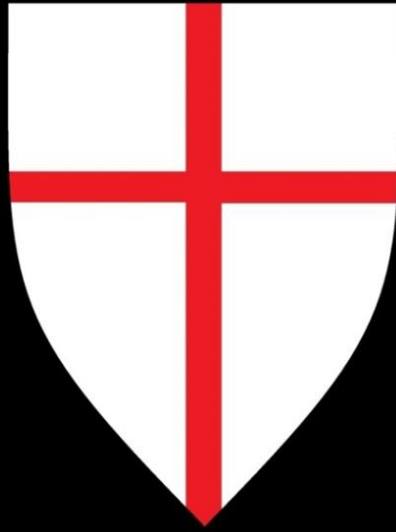


# Second Sunday of Epiphany: Year B

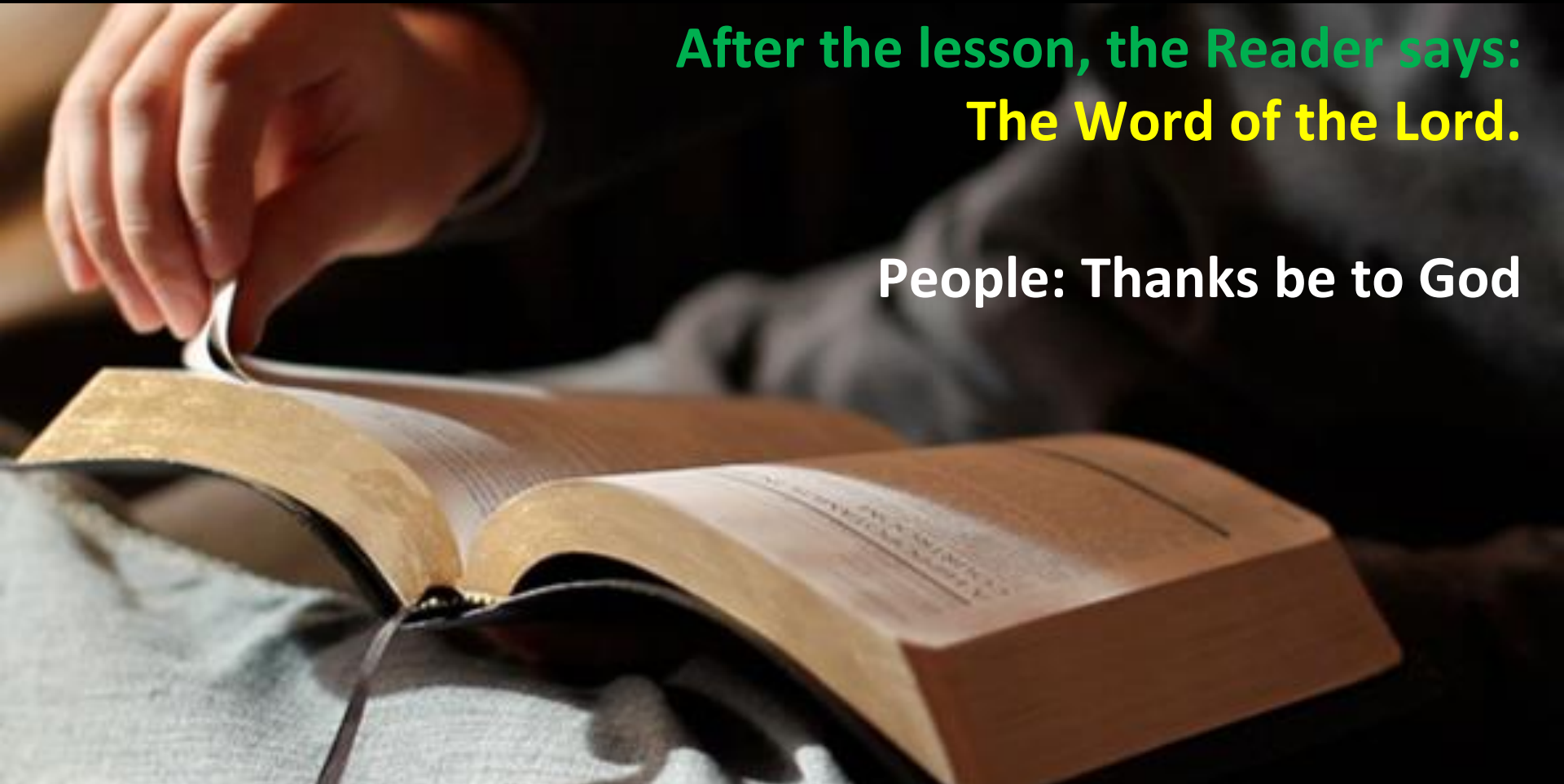

# The Nicene Creed

Please stand as we confirm our faith

We believe in one God,

the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

## Deacon:

It is right and our delight to give you thanks and praise, great Father, living God, supreme over the world, Creator, Provider, Savior, and Giver. **Deacon:**

Almighty God, owner of all things, We thank you for giving up your only Son to die on the cross for us who owe you everything. Pour your refreshing Spirit on us as we remember him in the way he commanded, through these gifts of your creation. On the same night that he was betrayed he took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

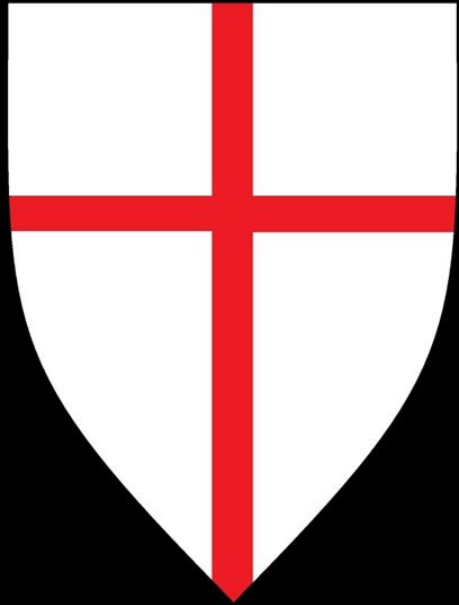

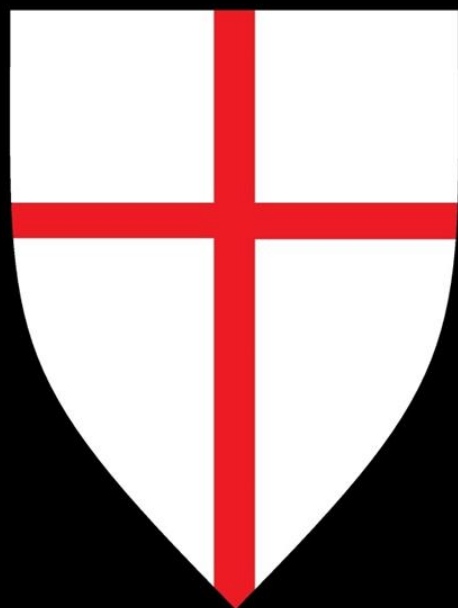
