- ⇒ 4-H is the largest youth development organization in the United States with nearly 6 million youth members.
- ⇒ With a direct connection to the United States Land Grant University System, 4-H is the first experience many young people have with higher education.
- ⇒ This youth development program is a global organization that teaches a range of life skills.
- ⇒ Almost 7,000,000 youth are served worldwide.
- ⇒ 4-H is located in:
 - 3,068 U.S. Counties
 - More than 50 Countries

- ⇒ Four times more likely to contribute to their communities
- ⇒ Two times more likely to make healthier choices
- ⇒ Two times more likely to participate in Science, Engineering, and Computer Technology programs during out-of-school time
