TCSF SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

TCSF operates the Temple City Summer School Program serving students in grades K-12. TCSF Summer School provides tuition-based courses for credit and non-credit in academics and enrichment. To facilitate the summer program, TCSF rents facilities from TCUSD, as well as equipment and materials owned by the District.

Grades K-8 Enrichment Programs: TCSF offers a mix of academic and enrichment subjects with hands-on exploration to help prepare students for the upcoming year and enhance their learning experience.

Grades 5-8 Band and Orchestra: Music Education continues in the summer with both Intermediate and Advanced courses being offered to grades 5-8. These classes offer an extended time frame for students to improve their skills in a fun filled summer program. If you are not sure if you should enroll for the "Intermediate" or "Advanced" Band or Orchestra classes, please check with Mr. Smith or Mr. Taylor before registering.

Grades 2-9 Musical Theatre: This is a "Junior Musical" performing arts experience. This class is looking for actors, singers, and dancers to perform at Temple City High School as part of the annual Summer Musical Theatre training program

TCSF CANCELLED CLASSES

Unfortunately, classes that do not meet enrollment requirements may be cancelled by TCSF. This process can occur in late May or early June. If TCSF must cancel a class, the parent of the guardian will be notified and have the option to select another available class, or request a refund for the full tuition of the cancelled class. The processing fee is not refundable.

FULL CLASSES & WAITING LISTS

WHEN A CLASS BECOMES FULL IT WILL NO LONGER APPEAR AS A CHOICE DURING THE PROCESS OF REGISTRATION. EACH YEAR THERE ARE SEVERAL CLASSES WHERE ENROLLMENT IS COMPETITIVE AND THE COURSE BECOMES FULL SHORTLY AFTER REGISTRATION BEGINS. IF FACILITIES AND QUALIFIED TEACHERS ARE AVAILABLE, TCSF WILL OPEN AN ADDITIONAL SECTION OF THAT CLASS. UNFORTUNATELY, IT IS NOT ALWAYS POSSIBLE TO MEET THE DEMAND FOR A PARTICULAR CLASS WHEN IT BECOMES FULL. OCCASIONALLY A STUDENT WILL CANCEL THEIR REGISTRATION, FREEING UP A SPOT IN THAT CLASS. YOU CAN ADD YOUR NAME TO THE WAITLIST FOR THE DESIRED CLASS DURING REGISTRATION. THIS IS A FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED LIST OF REQUESTS. YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED IF A SPOT BECOMES AVAILABLE IN THE CLASS OF YOUR CHOICE.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

TCSF does not provide transportation or after-school care, but before/after school care (K-6th Grade) is available at Longden Elementary School through the Extended Learning Program (ELP) for an additional fee. DROP-OFF / PICK-UP POLICY

Attention! Drop-Off and Pick-Up is located at the schools main entrances. Students must be picked up promptly! Parents of students not picked up will be charged. (After 12:00 p.m. noon, parents will be charged \$1.00 per minute for the first 15 minutes. \$25.00 for every 15 minutes thereafter. Failure to pay will result in the student's withdrawal from the program with no refund).

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Incoming Kindergarten students, and students who are not currently attending a TCUSD school, must provide a copy of their immunization record. The immunization record must include: Polio, DPT, MMR, Hepatitis B, Tdap, and Varicella immunizations, the date the immunizations were given, and the Physician's name. The immunization record must be in English. The English translations of an immunization records must be by a licensed medical provider.

Is your child starting Kindergarten in the fall? Are they nervous or shy about starting school? Does your child speak a language other than English? If so, this is the class for your child. "Look Out Kindergarten" is designed to help orient incoming student to the routines and activities they will experience in Kindergarten.
