A. Insurance and Benefits Bill Daniels

All is going well with the I&B Trust; enrollment numbers increasing. Bill will be in Sacramento tomorrow working on 2017 renewals.

If you have someone go out IOD and will probably be 4850. Please make sure they submit apps in to LTD anyway... just in case the WC claim is not picked up; in order to reduce processing delays.

The intent of LTD is to "bridge gap", so that participants are still being paid while out on an injury/illness. Make sure participants understand that if their WC claim is approved (and settled) that there may be reimbursement necessary.

John Kristofferson (Adams, Ferrone & Ferrone)

Recent LEO termination (for falsified police report) went to arbitrator. The arbitrator ruled in favor of the officer, but the decision was ignored by the city council. Court then ordered the arbitrator's decision be followed by the city.

Andrew Scott (Adams, Ferrone & Ferrone)

LA county case.

Member went out 4850 for approximately one year. Department decided to initiate an IA on the employee while on leave. IA tried to take credit for 4850 leave as admin leave. Member received credit for 4850 based on department's action.

Cancer case settlement.

Hire a Work Comp attorney that understands work comp, retirement and labor side of things.

Bill Hadden (Silver, Hadden, Silver & Levine)

Santa Barbara County – Kirsch & Johnson trial. Attorneys now seeking reinstatement of Kirsch after he was found not guilty in federal court. Oxnard Termination of Police Officer. Arbitrator ordered reinstatement with back pay. City Manager could not find argument against decision. In the meantime, officer had found alternate employment. Office is attempting to find resolution to the matter.

Sharon Lizardo (LDF Conflict Attorney, SLO)

Updated the members on the San Luis Obispo "Boot Camp" Case.

DA Investigator on perjury charges.

Ken Yuwiler (Silver, Hadden, Silver & Levine)

There is an uptick of Work Comp "Claims Agencies" using video to claim fraud on the part of public employees. Advise members to avoid questionable activities.

In April, PORAC went back to DC. Well received by the congressional representatives there. Second trip planned for September 19, 2016.

Friedrichs Case (Re: School Board Union dues)

US Supreme Court recently ruled in favor of employee associations, but 27 other cases dealing with ancillary issues are currently working their way through the courts.

As of the April 4th meeting, 200K has been contributed by PORAC for the Death Penalty reform and savings... enough signatures have been gathered to combat the Death Penalty repeal initiative. 67-70% likelihood of success if the initiative makes it to the ballot. The Death penalty repeal initiative is also likely to make it on the ballot. Whichever initiative gathers the most signatures will become law.

CPOMF's Peace Officers' Memorial was held May 1st & 2nd.

PORAC's Legislative day in Sacramento held May 2nd

SB1286 (Peace Officer records) is actively opposed by PORAC.

The bill went to appropriations PRIOR to legislative day.

We now have enough votes to kill the bill, but the bill was suspended prior to vote because of costs associated with its implementation.

All members are encouraged to participate in PORAC's legislative day. It is invaluable experience. Keep in mind that when in Sacramento for this event, or other political events, if you cannot schedule a meeting to speak directly with the respective politician, seek to speak with their chief of staff. Getting involved is the only way you will really see how PORAC's efforts benefit us.

Go to the Peace Officers' Memorial ceremony if you have not already.

XI. Good of the Chapter Round Table/Member Comments

Tony Sanders (VCDSA)

Endorsement for District 28 Assembly. Tyler Isen 38th Assembly District campaign. LA North & LA South chapters have both endorsed him. Both LA Chapters have asked that Tri-Counties contribute to Isen's campaign. His opponent, Jerrod DeGonia, endorsed by numerous Simi Valley political entities.

Jen Christensen (SB BOS 1st District Candidate)

Endorsed by SBDSA. Currently the county's investment officer. Started off as an attorney for the county. Running for 1st district supervisor seat vacated by Salud Carbajal. Husband is a retired SBSO deputy sergeant (34 years of service). SM Jail project in jeopardy. The county currently has an \$80M grant from state to build a north county jail. Understands the current staffing shortages in the department, as well as an openly hostile supervisor (Peter Adam) currently on the board.

Q&A

Comment: McFarlin (SBCDSA): We do not have a host of friends on BOS. We need more revenue and strong leadership on BOS. We (SBCDSA) have also endorsed another candidate, running for a different district, we feel will be beneficial to the department and the community.

Comment: Durant: There is currently a BOS supervisor that openly despises the Sheriff. He is taking it out on us.

Q. McFarlin: Put into words your thoughts on Public Safety pensions.

A. There is a lot of "pension envy" within the public. Making the pensions sustainable is the issue. Retroactivity of the benefit was what broke the system. The challenge is the Reed/Demaio initiative that is pending. PEPRA did a lot of things that will help people get past their concerns with the public pension system.

Q. Sanders: did PEPRA go far enough? What is your position, what do you think should be done?

A. PEPRA was a big help. Our pension fund was fully funded, but no more retroactive benefits should be granted. PEPRA did not go far enough in addressing executives getting around the "spiking rule". PEPRA did a lot in eliminating that. Pension CAPS for new employees tied to Social Security tables, were beneficial.

Q. Bill Daniels: Finances.....gas tax distribution.

A. There is only so much to divvy up. Needs put pressure on revenues.

Q. Javier Antunez: SBCDSA's current contract negotiations, thoughts?

A. Aware of overwhelming rejection of last contract. In the face of other bargaining units getting raises, it is beyond inequitable. Staffing shortages speak volumes as to where we are in comparison with other agencies. Serious issues need to be hashed out.

Vendors Dismissed for brief discussion by members only.

Tony Sanders (VCDSA) asked about cutting short the interview with Christensen. Hometown rule called into question.

Mike McGrew (SBPOA)

Last meeting the chapter endorsed Das Williams in the race. SBPOA has long standing relationship with Das. Hometown rule was brought up and Das was told the endorsement was a "pocket" endorsement until SBCDSA made an endorsement. Christensen has been on the Police and Fire Commission for a long time. She has a "heart" for public safety, but pension reforms are still a hot topic. Christensen does not separate in her campaign ads between attacks on public employee pensions and public safety employee pensions; addressing

"unfunded liabilities". A lot of the language she is using is reminiscent of the Reid/Demaio issues.

Matt Mcfarlin (SBCDSA-President)

Communication issue was the SBCDSA's fault. We have historically not done a good job of maintaining relationships with board and BOS. Asked for the chapter's support of Bruce Porter and Jen Christensen. Concerns VCDSA has brought up DO affect Ventura and other nearby agencies. County using total comps against us in negotiations. We have to find someone that will think for a change.

Don Douglass (VCPPOA)

What I heard Christensen say was that PEPRA did not go far enough. Das has been a fried to us in the past. The waters may be muddied moving forward.

Mike Durant (PORAC President)

Con Abel, Christensen's husband, and I have been friends for years. I sat down with Das 2 months ago and asked for his future plans. He would not commit to future with SB County. Concerns over him running for Hanna Beth's spot in the future.

Motion to withdraw the pocket endorsement, made at the March chapter meeting, of Das Williams was made by Javier Antunez and seconded by Roger Garcia. With no further discussion, the motion passes by unanimous vote of all members present.

Motion to endorse Bruce Porter for 3rd district supervisor was made by Matt McFarlin and seconded by Bill Daniels. With no further discussion, the motion passes by unanimous vote of all members present.

Motion to endorse Jenn Christensen for 1st district Supervisor was made by Matt McFarlin and seconded by Bill Daniels. With an abstention by Don Douglass of VCPPOA, the motion passed by vote of the remaining members present.

Motion to rescind monetary PAC for Das Williams, passed at the March chapter meeting, made by Javier Antunez and seconded by Bill Daniels. With no further discussion, the motion passed by unanimous vote of all members present.

Motion to donate \$1000 to Jenn Christensen's campaign was made by Roger Garcia and seconded by Tony Sanders. With an abstention by Don Douglass of VCPPOA, the motion passed by vote of the remaining members present.

Don Douglass (VCPPOA)

Rogelio Cruz has been newly appointed as the VCPPOA president. VCPPOA has endorsed a couple of their own BOS candidates. Incumbent 1st District Supervisor Bennett is being challenged by David Grao (Pension reform proponent). VCPPOA is working in support of Bennett.

Roger (OPOA)

Association has reached impasse with city; will be going to fact-finding soon.

Mike McGrew (SBPOA)

Association has entered into negotiations with the city recently. The meetings will be interesting, but the association does have a few "friends" on the council so hopefully we will receive a decent contract. Interim chief, Crombach, has been appointed.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Tony Sanders and seconded by Bill Daniels. Motion passed by unanimous vote of all members present.
