Regular Meeting Minutes, 09 August, 2018

Our last meeting was held 6:30-8:30 pm, Thursday, 09 August, 2018 at the Richland Library Sandhills (Village of Sandhills Shopping Center), 763 Fashion Drive, Columbia, SC 29223.

Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report:
 - a. Bank balance = \$5,732.51.
 - b. Cash on Hand (CoH) reported by the treasurer was \$288.00.
 - c. Total Treasury with CoH reported by the treasurer = \$6,020.51.
 - d. Deposited in August was \$733.13 from IPMS as their residual share of the show expenses.
 - e. There were no expenses.

Reminder: Club Annual Dues of \$12 per member for 2018 are due starting in January. Still \$12 for adults with no dues for juniors under 18 years old. New adult member dues are pro-rated at \$1 per month for the remainder of the calendar year, first month's meeting attendance excluded. Please see the treasurer, Ralph Nardone, if you need to pay your dues.

- 2) We discussed the club's plans for the SE Toy Soldier Show to be held Saturday, 11 August at the SC State Museum on Gervais St. We will be presenting a club display / exhibition of member works along with "live action" demos.
- 3) 2019 Scale Model Mega-Show items reported/discussed:
 - a. The IPMS Mid-Carolina chapter has been formally invited to co-host our 2019 show.
 - b. The written application for the Bluff Road armory venue with the SC NG has been submitted. The selected dates are Friday / Saturday, 21-22 July, 2019. These dates do not conflict with any published AMPS, IPMS or SCMA shows within our region.
 - c. Tim Darrah has contacted both of the food truck vendors from our 2018 show and invited them back for 2019. As of the meeting, only Southern Mommas has replied and said that they will come back for 2019.
 - d. As soon as we have a reply from the IPMS chapter, we'll begin official promotion and solicitation efforts.
 - e. We're looking for volunteers to take on the jobs for raffle coordinator and show promotion coordinator.
- 4) The floor was opened for any new business:
 - a. Members in attendance suggested that we plan another tour of the NACM facilities in early January, 2019. The scheduling in early January would avoid conflicts with school dates. Mike Roof will contact our POC, David Hobbs, and begin coordination.
 - b. Members in attendance discussed and resolved to go back to our old meeting times, 6-8 pm. Our next regular meeting will be scheduled for 6-8pm, 13 September.
- 5) Demonstration Discussion: Using Dry Transfers, by Mike Roof.
- 6) After the business portion of the meeting, we held our usual **Show & Tell** of new builds and works-in-progress. We drew for the monthly raffle prize winner at the end of the meeting. Ralph, our treasurer, sold raffle tickets during the meeting. See the Meeting Photos page on our website for all of the completed and works in progress brought to this month's meeting!
- 7) After the meeting, a number of members went to Red Robin for the "after the meeting meeting". We are still in search of a good place. A suggestion was been made to just go back to Schiano's Pizza next to the Publix, and three members did this.

Tentative Agenda, Regular Meeting, 13 September, 2018

Our next regular meeting will take place 6-8 pm, THURSDAY, September 13, 2018, at Richland Library Sandhills (Village of Sandhills Shopping Center), 763 Fashion Drive, Columbia, SC 29223.

Tentative Agenda Business items:

- 1) Treasurer's Report:
 - a. **Total Treasury** = \$6,020.51 (with CoH reported last month).
 - b. **Bank Balance** = \$5,732.51.
 - c. **Cash on Hand** = To be reported by the treasurer.
 - d. **Deposits this Month** = None.
 - e. Expenses this Month = None.

Reminder: Club annual dues are due this month. Still \$12 for adults with no dues for juniors under 18 years old. New adult member dues are pro-rated at \$1 per month for the remainder of the calendar year, first month's meeting attendance excluded.

- 2) The 2018 Toy Soldier Show was held on Saturday, 11 August at the SC State Museum on Gervais Street, which was well attended and patronized by club members.
 - a. We had 15 AMPS members who brought along almost 50 models for a club display / exhibition of member works. In addition, Ben & Noah provided a "live model building demo," Tom McCoy conducted a day-long figure painting demonstration and Ralph conducted two airbrushing demos.
 - b. The IPMS/USA Midlands "Swamp Foxes" chapter and the Lexington chapter of the SCMA also set up displays and engaged the general public.
 - c. The combined scale model clubs setup and manned about 80 linear feet of table space with probably close to 150-175 models on display. We exhibited our work from the time the museum opened until about 4 pm and the scheduled close of the show.\
 - d. General public attendance at the Toy Soldier Show seemed down from previous years, but that was likely because there was a large Lego show also being held at the Columbia Metropolitan Convention Center. Still, all of the clubs got a lot of foot traffic past their tables.
 - e. Thanks to our SC State Museum hosts for inviting us again this year! They not only provided us an excellent location on the mezzanine level of the museum, but this year they brought around iced bottle water and snacks all day!
- 3) 2019 June Scale Model Mega-Show Report:

- a. The IPMS Mid-Carolina chapter has formally accepted our invitation to co-host our 2019 show. They discussed and voted to do so at their Wednesday, 15 August meeting. All the members present voted in favor of accepting our invitation as did all but one member voting absentee.
- b. Tim Darrah, the 2019 show vendor coordinator, has already sold or reserved 9 tables with 4 vendors. A very good start!
- c. Now that the IPMS chapter has accepted our invitation, we'll begin official promotion and solicitation efforts. Our first opportunity will be the IPMS R-12 show this coming Saturday, 15 September. Anyone attending this show should take any chances you get to let folks know about our 2019 show.
- d. We are still looking for volunteers to take on the jobs for raffle coordinator and show promotion coordinator. If you're able to give up some time for the club, let me know. You'll get detailed guidance and instructions, so you won't have to figure it all out or make it up on your own. We can have raffle donations delivered to either my house or to Ralph's house and one of us will maintain an inventory, so if you don't have room for storage, that can be worked around.
- 4) 2019 Scale Model MEGA-Show Theme: This month we need to discuss and select our top 3 choices for a show theme. Once we have our top ideas, the combined contest (AMPS and IPMS) committee will take all the ideas, to include the ones put forward by the IPMS chapter, and either select one or use all of the ideas to suggest a theme that will work for both clubs.

Put on your "thinking caps" and come to the meeting with some ideas and suggestions.

- 5) Mike Roof has contacted our NACM POC, David Hobbs, about scheduling a tour of the facilities in early January. David is working the issue on his end.
- 6) SC Confederate Relic Room and Military Museum FSB RIPCORD diorama commission: This month we need to discuss and vote on whether or not to reaccept the museum's commission for a 1/72 scale diorama of FSB RIPCORD. We owe the museum an answer within a few days after this month's meeting.
 - a. The museum's specifications for the work have not changed since this time last year when we voted to accept the commission only to have the museum postpone the project. Anyone who needs to refresh their memories about the project's details should contact Mike Roof. We can also discuss any of these at the meeting.
 - b. The museum has decided that the diorama (should we accept the project) will be displayed in the atrium near the Relic Room's entrance. It will likely be on display for at least two years. The museum will contract separately for a protective acrylic case to be built to cover the entire diorama. The overall dimensions of the diorama will remain unchanged – approximately 8'x12' – and the diorama will be displayed to afford all around viewing. The Relic Room will reimburse us for the costs of the materials, but we would be donating our time and effort.
 - c. The new projected delivery window would be the end of February / beginning of March, 2019. That's about six months, which is doable, but which does not offer much in the way of Murphy time. We'd have to jump on the job right away.

- d. Mike Roof is still willing provide the shop space for the main diorama construction. However, it will take at least 8-10 volunteers to do all the work, to include building and finishing the detail models and assisting with the construction of the main diorama.
- 7) David Bridges has sent us another very generous kit donation for our raffle. This time he sent us a total of 13 kits (which includes two, 1/48 scale Eduard FW-190 kits). We need to decide whether to add these kits to our monthly raffle prize pool or to hold them for our 2019 show raffle. Unlike the last donation that David sent us, we did not have to pay for the shipping for these kits, so if we put them in the 2019 show raffle prize pool, they will not have cost us anything out of our treasury.
- 8) Floor will be open for New Business.
- **9)** After the business portion of the meeting, we'll **Show & Tell** of new builds and works-inprogress. We'll also draw for the monthly raffle prize winner at the end of the meeting. See Ralph, our treasurer, for raffle tickets at any time during the meeting.
- **10)** After the meeting, everyone is invited to join us for the "meeting after the meeting"! This month we're still in search of a good place.
 - a. Several members have suggested that we pick a place on Killian Road near Killian Crossing (the new mall near exit 22, I-77). Since we have to all get in cars and drive somewhere anyway, this could work. For most of the club members, it would be more or less on their way home.
 - b. Last month, we went back to Schiano's Pizza which is only a couple of minutes by car from the new meeting location, but we only had 3 folks.
 - c. Other ideas and suggestions are welcome.



Mike Roof has provided us with a great link he found that may be of interest to all.

"For those who are interested in preserved AFVs or photographing them for research, here's a link to the latest issue of the AFV Register Organization's "The USA Historical AFV Register."

The register is broken down by state and city, with the AFVs listed along with their exact locations (to include GPS lat/long coordinates). This is a good list to keep saved on your computer.

If you travel around you can plan accordingly (look up your travel destination or itinerary stops to see what interesting AFVs might be there), and if you need reference material on a particular vehicle, you can often contact one of your "virtual" friends online who lives near an exhibit to take some pictures for you".



In short, if we say we're donating our time an effort to do this, we are making a real commitment that we will have to fulfill.

This project would involve many of you working directly on some aspect of it, and it WILL involve ALL of you as its success or failure will reflect on the entire club and everyone in it. Everyone's voice counts.
