Hi, happy summer! The Children in Action ministry has been growing and busy. I have an update to share with you about them this month. Enjoy.



"The Children in Action class has been learning about missions in other countries. They have been doing some mission work of their own in our community through service projects. With each project the children have learned to help others, to

share God's love, and have invited many in our community to visit our church to learn about God. We have been very busy with the Operation Christmas Child ministry, collecting canned goods for crisis control, collecting 138 stuffed animals for Union Cross Fire Department to give to children during stressful times like an auto accident, injury or house fire to comfort them, buying blankets for the homeless and inside each placing a message of hope, an invitation for salvation, and a five dollar gift. Our most recent community service project was for the No Kill Animal Shelter to provide pet food, pet toys, and love to the animals. We were able to provide the organization with a two hundred dollar donation as well. The children helped to walk and play with the dogs being adopted at the Petco Store. We also handed out an invitation to each customer visiting the Petco Store and talked with them. Again all Hospice Ministry donations are appreciated and our next emphasis will be **Sunday**, **July 8**th.

On Sunday, June 24th, 45 ladies and girls came out for our annual tea. The theme this year was "Success" and we were successful with our inspirational messages, poems, games, challenges, fellowship, and with our donations to the Dress for Success organization. We were very grateful to have 155 articles of clothing, 19 pairs of shoes, 133 hygiene items, 70 pieces of jewelry, 9 purses, 52 articles of underwear plus miscellaneous items, and a gift card (all totaling 483) donated and were also very blessed to have Christine from that group give such an uplifting talk. Thank you to all those who helped with set up for the event, to those who participated in the program, those who help serve refreshments, and to those who helped with the cleanup—just could not have done it without you! \$100 of WOM funds was used as an additional donation to the DFS group, but as in the past, no other WOM funds were used for the cost of tea--it was privately funded.

Please note this important change our July meeting – both date and place! On <u>Tuesday, July 10th</u>, (<u>not the 4th nor the 17th</u> that we discussed at our June meeting), we are meeting at the church at 6:30pm to go to Mayberry's Ice Cream Shop in HP for our meeting and a time of fellowship. <u>AND the Baptist Men will be joining us!!!</u> We have an area of the facility reserved already!

We have 16 slots to fill and 12 of those are already filled with the remaining balance to be filled on a first volunteer basis.
