Why?

GoHA is a child-centred ministry. In Africa there are millions of children who are sick or orphaned because of sicknesses such as AIDS.

There are millions of children in Kenya who are not in school. Two-thirds of those missing out on education are girls.

These factors will impinge on family life and future generations of children.

GoHA is therefore dedicated to making each child's world a better place in which to live.

Where?

Khayega is a small town in the District of Kakamega in Kenya.

The main source of income for the local community comes from growing maize. However most do not have access to enough land to grow sufficient to feed their families, as well as obtain an income.

Projects

The Donald Romeo Community School opened its doors to children in the Khayega area of Kenya in 2003.

The DRA provides primary education for over 300 children aged 4-13 years old, with a staff of eight.

Ten percent of the children are AIDS orphans.

The majority of the others are from families where there is only one parent present.

Students do NOT pay fees and they are provided with two free meals each day. School uniforms are also provided where necessary.

School

The building is also used as a health centre. Providing care of children with malaria, intestinal worms, malnutrition and skin infections.

GoHA plans to provide a full time qualified nurse and a nursing assistant, plus a twice weekly doctor's clinic.

Good Health Africa has acquired twenty acres of land which will enable the project to benefit the community through:

- food for the school's kitchen.
- employment for members of the community.
- training for the development of agricultural skills for students and the wider community.

Over the past seven years all of our funds have been raised through donations and fund raising events.

Good Health Africa is presently in the process of obtaining charity status.
