Hi all, we had a great time at Bunny's house eating clam chowder and talking about the March and April books. In March our book was <u>Wicked Pissed: New England's Most Famous Feuds</u> by Ted Reinstein. Ted Reinstein is best known as a journalist and reporter for "Chronicle," Boston's TV newsmagazine much like our own Fritz Wetherbee. This book tells the background story about a lot of feuds involving sports, politics, food, finance, aviation, engineering and boundaries that have been around for centuries. If you want to learn the story behind some of the history of New England this was a delightful read. It is a short book. For those who read the book, we enjoyed the knowledge gained in this somewhat humorous accounting of the feuds.

The book is a story about a 104 year old woman and the young boy who has been sent to help her and how their friendship changed the woman's life. We all seemed to enjoy the book despite some lists some found monotonous and passages that should have been read out loud or listened to rather than reading. We have two more meetings this year before we take our summer break. The book for May is <u>The</u> <u>Midnight Library</u> by Matt Haig which takes us on a journey between life and death to a library which allows us to make other choices in our life than the ones we have already chosen.
