The FAFSA is the application for many grants, scholarships (free money), federal student loans (pay those back) and work-study (students work and earn a paycheck). It's the first step in the financial aid process. The FAFSA may be used as the TOPS application or parents may use the TOPS On-line Application (if you feel you won't qualify for federal aid). Plan on completing the FAFSA every year the student is in college, even if you think you won't qualify for any aid. It can't hurt to have a backup plan.
