## Mr. Dowd's Classes

Students in 7th grade Religion and 7th and 8th grade Social Studies are hard at work studying several interesting concepts. In 7th grade Religion we are studying the Bishop's Confirmation questions in preparation of next year's receiving of the actual sacrament. While talking about a different saint each day, we try to apply their commitment to the Lord with what we face everyday as Christians. In studying the New Testament, the 7th grade is learning of the Infancy Narratives and Jesus' early life in ministry. We are constantly trying to prepare our lives for a life serving the Church.



In 7th grade Social Studies the students have finished Central and South America. We are now looking at the geography, history, economy, and poli-

tics of the African continent. We are comparing Africa's environment and customs to our own. Later on in the month each student will hand in a poster project on an African country. The students also are studying current events. It is important to be aware of the issues of today on a local, state, national, and international stage.

The 8th grade students are getting used to their brand new

textbooks. American history continues to be very interesting with studying early explorers and the colonizing of the North American conti-



nent. Later this month the students will be handing in a project studying a particular English colony and comparing colonial times with modern times. It will be curious to see how things were done 300 years ago in early America.

We learned how to recognize and respond in an emergency situation and what to do before EMS arrives. cups, regular sized cups, and jumbo cups. Students also got to test their quickness as they timed themselves doing the various




stacks. Everyone had a great time and a special thank you to Miss Majeski for helping us out this year!

complete without a slice of their famous homemade pizza!


