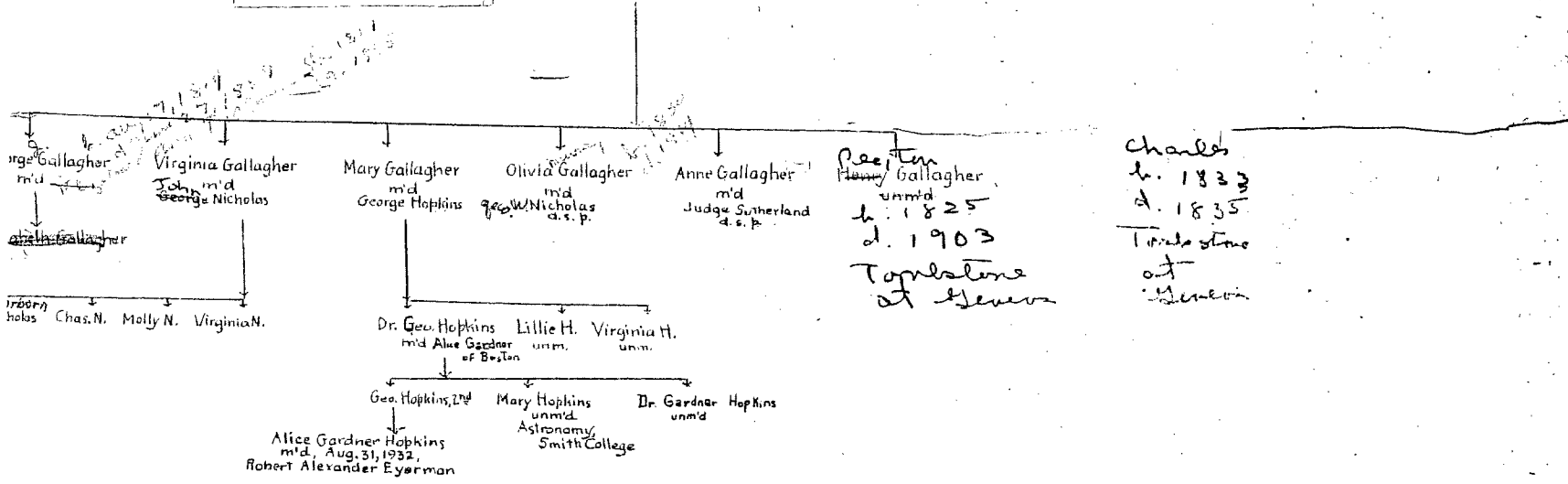
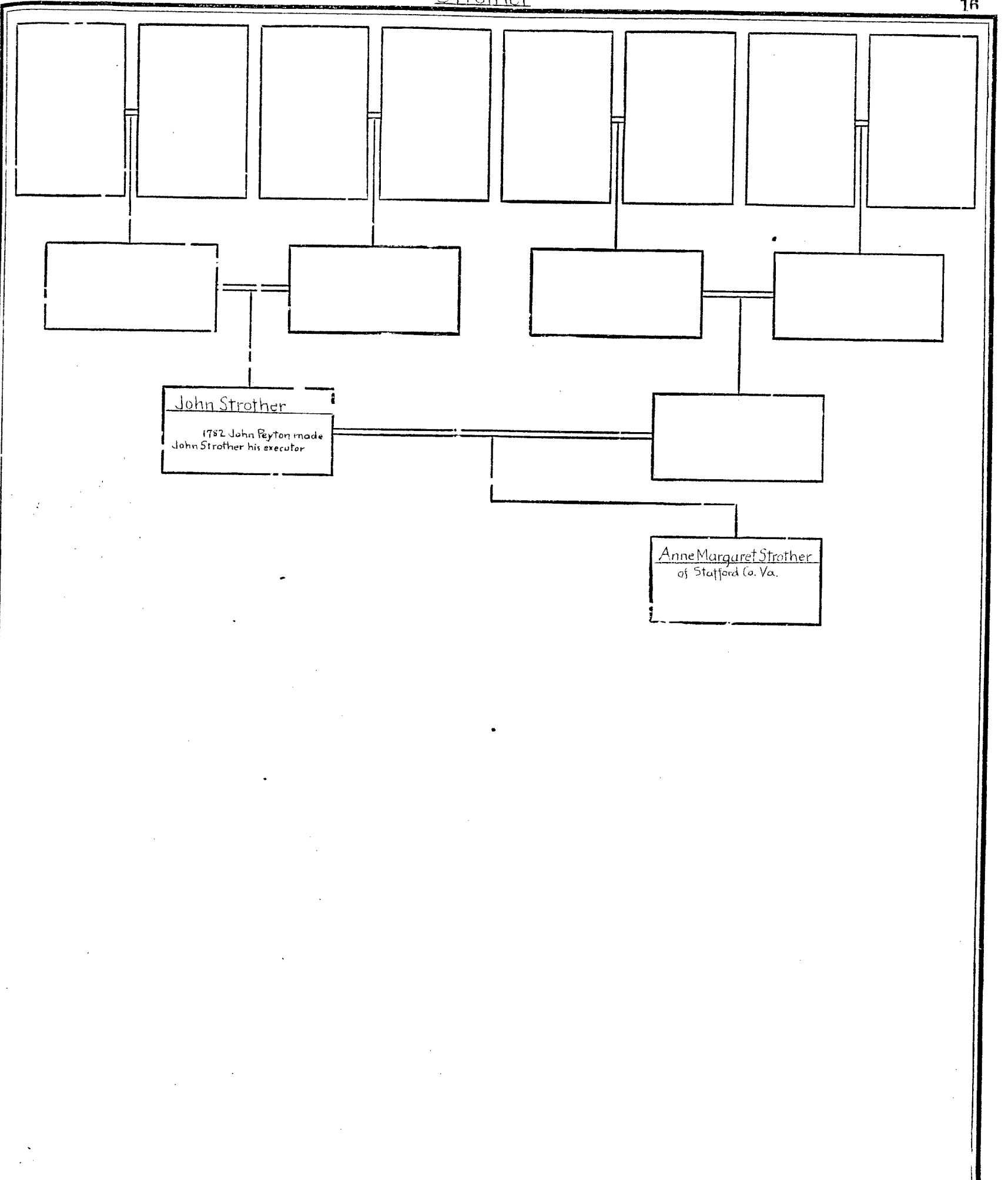

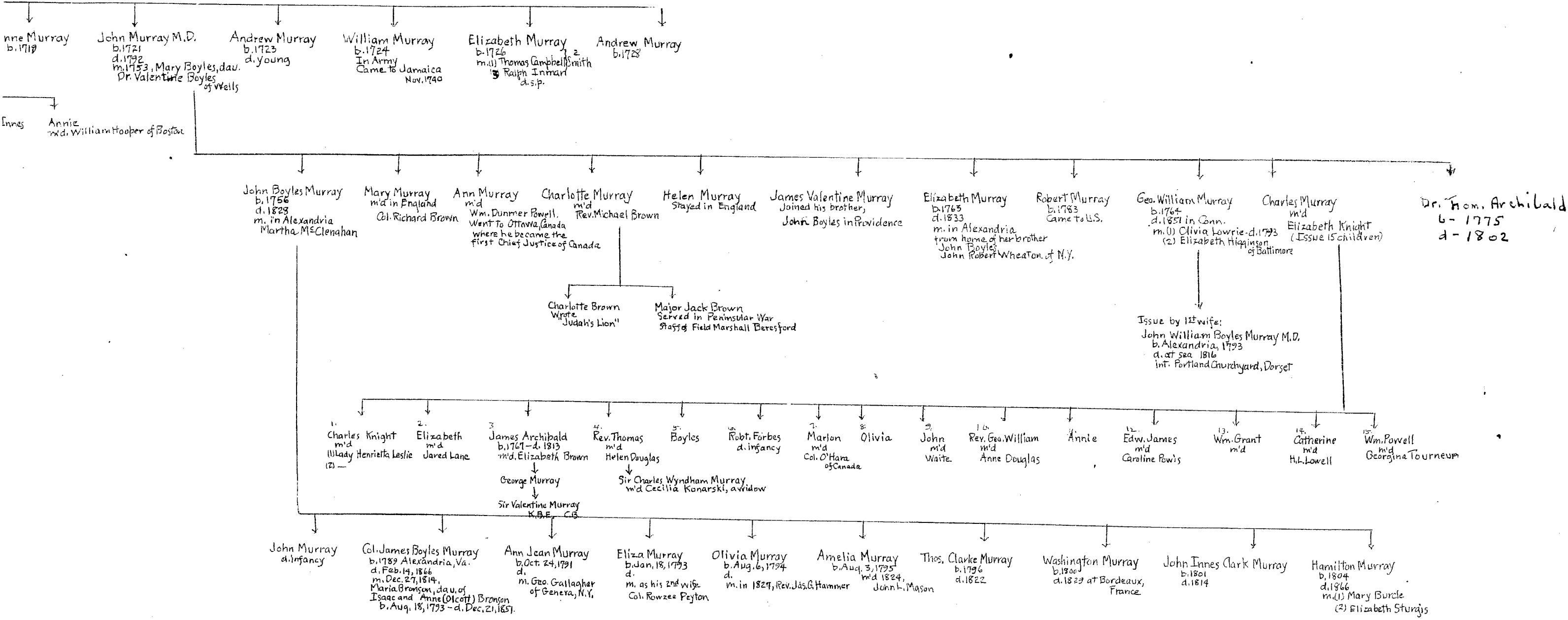

BRONSON

Isaac Bronson was descended from one of the first settlers of Waterbury, Connecticut. He studied medicine and entered the army as a junior surgeon in the Revolutionary War, November 14, 1779, in the second Regiment Light Dragoons, Connecticut Line. It unfortunately fell to his lot to have the charge of Major Andre during the latter's captivity. It is a matter of history that the English officer when acknowledging his identity, requested that an express be sent to New York for his valet and valise, and that in the interim he requested Colonel Bronson to loan him "a change of linen," which was done, and in his official capacity was present at the execution of Major Andre. In after years Colonel Bronson could never bear the slightest allusion to this painful episode of his life. After peace was concluded Colonel Bronson abandoned medicine and made a voyage to India, and on his return started in business as a Banker. He founded the bank at Bridgeport, Connecticut, May 21, 1807, and settled in New York after his marriage with the daughter of Thomas Olcott. The young couple selected for their country home a most beautiful spot on Greenfield Hill, Connecticut, and bought it in 1796. The house had been owned by Doctor Dwight who wrote many odes and sonnets in praise of his rural retreat.

ARCHIBALD DE MORAVIA, mentioned in the Chartulary of Newbottle, 1280; swore fealty to Edward I 1296; m. a daughter of Sir David Olifard of Selkirk

ROGER DE MORAVIA, 1321 obtained a charter from James, Lord Douglas, superior of his lands "Terrarum de Fala" (subsequently designated "Falahill"; d. 1330

ALEXANDER MURRAY, of Falahill name in charter under great seal of Robt. II before 1380

PATRICK MURRAY of Falahill 1413

JOHN MURRAY had charter July 20, 1461 of the lands of Philiphaugh in Selkirkshire
