## December Block of the Month: Ohio Star

Materials:
Main Fabric: 2-5 1/4" squares, subcut each square on the diagonal (corner to corner forming an X ) in both direction, forming 8 quarter square triangles.
4-4 1/2" squares

Contrast Fabric: 2-5 1/4" squares, subcut each square on the diagonal (corner to corner forming an X ) in both direction, forming 8 quarter square triangles.
1-4 1/2" square

Construction:
Sew together 8 pairs of main and contrast quarter square triangles. Press. Then sew the pairs together to make 4 units, main fabric matched to contrast fabric. Press and measure. Each unit should be 4 1/2" square.

Assemble 4 1/2"

units and $41 / 2$ " squares into rows, referring to diagram for placement and position. Press and measure. Finished block should measure 12 1/2" square.

Alternate technique for making quarter square units:

Draw a diagonal
line on the back of each of the light $51 / 4$ " squares. Pair a dark 5 $1 / 4$ " with a light $51 / 4$ " square right sides together and sew a $1 / 4$ " seam on either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on line and press toward dark.

Draw a line on back of half of the new units. Pair right sides together. Match units turning one so the seams form an X. Sew a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on line and press toward dark. Finished unit should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and match diagram.
***Remember your $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.***
You can choose to make a complete quilt top by repeating these instructions or you can set this block aside and make a sampler quilt. We look forward to seeing everyone's blocks.
