It's going to be a bit different this year!

- ♥ Shopping will take place on December 12th at the Methodist Church and begin to wrap up around 2pm.
- ♥ Starting at 8am, individuals or groups of immediate family members of 8 or fewer can come in the north wooden doors to shop.
- ♥ Tables will be 6ft apart and only one family per every other table will be allowed to shop at a time.
- ♥ If you arrive and we are full inside the church, our greeter will ask that you please wait in your car until a volunteer notifies you that you may begin shopping.
- ♥ We ask that you stay together as a family and follow the arrows on the ground to direct you through all tables.
- ♥ All shoppers will be required to wear a mask at all times while shopping and use hand sanitizer prior to shopping.

From the Pastor's Desk



Advent and Christmas greetings y'all,

I pray and hope that you are staying safe and hopeful these challenging times. Few of us would have imagined that by now, during holidays and as 2020 comes to a close, we would not only still be dealing with the pandemic, but actually experiencing a resurgence in coronavirus infections. It's understandable that we are tired, frustrated, anxious and disheartened.

The need for hope is most often expressed in times of crisis. Everyone experiences days when life is overwhelming. Countless sources of despair assault us. Violence, health crises, too much work or no employment, broken relationships, death, a sense of meaninglessness, and an unspecified but sustained anxiety are a few of the realities that keep coming. Though we marshal our energies to resist them, they persist.

Yet even when the forces of despair are succeeding, hope abides. As the apostle Paul wrote: "We are afflicted, in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9).

Despite our pain, anxieties, and failures, hope abides because hope is not just the creation of our feelings. Hope is a force at work to enliven us even when we feel overwhelmed. The emphasis upon crisis does not mean that hope occurs only in situations of distress.

I recently read an Excerpt from "The Work of Hope" by Luther E. Smith Jr. Luther writes that "... Crisis amplifies our need for hope, but hope is essential to living the ordinary days. Like a drowning man gasping for breath, the air so desperately needed was just as crucial when he lived his days in routine. His lungs deprived of air intensify his desperation. But his need to breathe was no less acute when times were tranquil. Likewise, hope sustains us even when we are unaware of our dependence on it. Hope is essential regardless of circumstances."

Our challenge is to be always enlivened to life—on the days of trauma and the days of great ease. Living as persons of hope in ordinary times can be foundational to the spiritual formation that enables us to be persons of hope in crisis.

Wishing each of you a truly hopeful Advent season and a meaningful Christmas.
