

WOMEN LEADERS OF THE SUFFRAGE HIKE FROM NEW YORK TO ALBANY



New York, Dec. 16—General Rosalie Jones and her chief aid, Colonel Ida C. Craft, have completed the schedule for the hike to Albany. Following will be the camping places of the pilgrim army: Dec. 16, the first night out, the army will camp at Irvington-on-Hudson; 17th, Ossining; 18th, Peekskill; 19th, Fishkill-on-Hudson; 20th, Wappinger's Falls; 21st, Poughkeepsie; 22d, Rhinebeck; 23d, Germantown, and 24th, Hudson, where the army will rest over Christmas, attend the county ball in the evening and make votes for women speeches between the dances. Leaving Hudson on the morning of Dec. 26, the Pilgrims will camp at Stuyvesant Falls that night, at Valatie the 27th, Schodack the 28th

and, to keep Sunday like the religious Pilgrims of olden times, it will remain for church and speechmaking before moving on to Rensselaer to meet the woman suffragists who will come down from Albany to join the army and add their forces to the host that will march on the capitol to present Governor Sulzer with a secret message. Adolph Major of Brooklyn, a believer in equal suffrage, has volunteered to accompany the walkers in his auto and will carry the peanuts, chocolate and sandwiches that will furnish luncheons between towns. He will also carry the extra supply of literature that the women will need and also the suitcases that will contain extra apparel.
