LOUISIANA

The federal court for the Territory of Orleans was unique in that it was designated a separate judicial district in 1804, the only time this was done in a territory of the continental U.S.¹ Louisiana was admitted to the Union in 1812 with its judiciary organized as a single district with complete federal jurisdiction.² The state was reorganized into two districts on three separate occasions. In 1823, it was divided into the Eastern and Western Districts (though with one judgeship serving both).³ Reunification occurred in 1845,⁴ followed by an Eastern–Western division four years later.⁵ The final iteration began with unification in 1866,⁶ followed by reorganization into the Eastern and Western Districts in 1881.⁷

LA.ED.01 is the original district judgeship (see Judge Hall's succession line). During all three instances when the state's district bench was unified, this was the extant seat. After the first reorganization from Eastern and Western Districts to single district, no positions were affected because one judgeship served both. In the second unification, LA.WD.01 was abolished, and recreated as LA.WD.02 when the state was divided in 1881.

When the Middle District was created in 1971,⁸ LA.ED.04 was transferred and became LA.MD.01. In 1997, Congress transferred LA.ED.03 to the Middle District (LA.MD.03).⁹ Louisiana has been lodged in the Fifth Circuit since 1842.¹⁰ The state has twenty-two judges: twelve in the Eastern District, three in the Middle District, and seven in the Western District.
