Dear Christian friends,

First, I want to thank you for the warm welcome I received this last Sunday morning. I was touched by your greetings, applause and wonderful cake and balloons! You sure made me feel a part of Calvary community. It is a joy to be back among you.

I don't know how I can thank you enough for the gift of time you gave me for sabbatical. On the first day of my sabbatical, I got up at 5:00 in the morning and began to write. I wrote until about four or five o'clock that day, and continued to write eight to ten hours a day. For most of the summer I did two things, walk my dogs and write. I continued that pattern for about six weeks of my sabbatical. And then backed off a bit. I thought, I need a break from my sabbatical. So I visited Jordan and Devynn in Portland. As you know, I have several passions. Three in particular. Writing, Music, and Jesus. I so appreciate the time you gave me to write. I also wrote a couple of songs and played music just one weekend with my brothers in Seattle.

Now, I am happy to use my time to worship together, join together in Bible Studies, Youth Group, Confirmation Class, Fellowship time, as well as the times to dance, to grieve, to sing, to mourn, to work together, and to struggle together as we discern God's spirit and will for Calvary Lutheran Church and our surrounding community. I am passionate for building an intentional Christian community committed to listening, prayer, Bible study and following Jesus. 

Christian Education:

Finance Committee:



I heard on the radio recently, a funny interview with one of the astronauts on the Apollo 8 mission to the moon. The astronaut was not heroic, he was not excited about going into space, and he did not find wonderment in the way objects floated in space, or in the view of earth from outer space or of the moon as they orbited around the moon but did not land. This person was the most pragmatic, uncomplicated person you could know. The reporter asked him, wouldn't it be good to have a poet in space, someone who could describe the beauty of the earth and express what it feels like to be in space?

This astronaut said, "The last person I would want in space would be a poet. That made me laugh. But the astronaut had a point. You want the right kind of person for the work. In space they needed someone pragmatic to fly the space ship. They didn't need a poet.

Calvary needs a working finance committee. We have a group of very smart people who did some work as a finance committee last year, but I don't think they signed up for a life-long tour of duty. What I am looking for now, is someone who would be willing to lead a finance committee, talk to the ones that have served, and to others so we can have a regularly meeting functioning finance committee. I wonder if the finance committee would want a poet.

Worship Team—Assisting Ministers, Lectors, Ushers, Greeters:



I want to thank all of you who help worship and fellowship happen year after year. I can always count on the Altar Guild to have the altar prepared and the elements of communion ready for the Lord's Supper in the middle of worship.

Musicians practice and prepare to play the liturgy, Hymns and prelude pieces. The Band and rehearses and plays the second Sunday of every month.

Someone lights the candles passes out the offering baskets and puts the candles out at the end of service.

Readers read, Assistants assist, Greeters greet, Ushers ush. And we give thanks for all you do.

However, someone needs to coordinate the volunteers for worship. Scheduling volunteers does not happen on its own. Julie Perger did a great job recruiting and coordinating worship assistants. Eli Gonzales barely got started but she has moved to California. We will miss her.

Please spend some time in thoughtful prayer, and see if you might be the one to coordinate the worship leaders. This work requires some coordinating and social skills, computer skills help, but the church has been coordinating worship help for two thousand years without a computer, so you can decide how you want to do this. See if the Holy Spirit is tugging on your heart to be a worship coordinator. This is an urgent need.

Fellowship:



Likewise, let's talk about fellowship. After worship, we all seem to like cookies, cakes, coffee and juice. It is a wonderful time for us to greet one another and deepen the friendships we have in Christ. Passing of the Peace in worship takes a long time because you are all so eager to chat. We can shave five minutes off of worship if we leave our conversations for after the service. Carol and Edie have been faithful providers of refreshments. I know that many of you have brought sweet treats and healthy treats to share. I am sure we would like fellowship time to continue and we are going to need your help.

On Reading Bonhoeffer:

During my Sabbatical I read Bonhoeffer's book <u>Life Together</u>. I will say more about this book in upcoming newsletter articles, but now I want to emphasize one important truth from the book— it is a privilege to live together as a Christian community. I don't think we realize what a great privilege it is that we can come together on Sundays and in the middle of the week to worship, to pray, to work together, to sing together, to study God's word and to have conversations, even arguments about how to live out God's calling for each of us and for all of us as a community in these times. Calvary Lutheran Church on Jackson School Road is a precious gift that God has given us, for which we can give God thanks and praise, and for which we can gladly work together to make happen.

Bonhoeffer began his book with a quotation, Psalm 133.1 "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren [and sisteren] to dwell together in unity!" Not only does Bonhoeffer understand the privilege of being physically together for worship and prayer and thanksgiving to God, he also helps us understand what Christian community is and how Christ is the center of it all. When we come together, we don't just greet each other, the Christ who dwells in each of us meets the Christ in each other. In other words, our relationship with each other and with the church is entirely a gift of God through Christ without whom there would be no community here. Likewise, when we consider the simple work that is necessary for the good of this church and the surrounding community, such easy work, really, we are not asked to do too much, we can and should consider it a great privilege to serve God and our fellow Christians in these small and easy ways. I pray that we would have a spirit of eagerness and joy to do even the simplest things, acolyte, usher, serve coffee and treats at fellowship hour and so forth, knowing that all we do is by the grace of God through Christ and for the love, joy and praise we willingly offer to the Christ in one another. Friends in Christ it is a privilege to serve you and Jesus, please step up gladly to serve each other in Christ and extend that service to the grace-anemic world.

Water

Scripture:

It is in hope of God's promised fulfillment that we hear the call to justice; it is in hope that we take action. When we act interdependently and in solidarity with creation, we do justice. Fact:

In the lower 48 United States, 53 percent of wetlands have been lost in the last 200 years. Wetlands serve important ecological functions. They filter harmful chemicals, prevent flooding by storing water, and provide wildlife habitat.

Commitment:

Immediate- Though drinking bottled water is popular, the amount of waste generated from the disposal of plastic water bottles is astronomical! Today, purchase a reusable water bottle and commit yourself to using reusable bottles as much as possible.

Long Term- The average washing machine uses 40 gallons of water per load! Consider using a high efficiency washer, or combining laundry loads to use the washer less. Make a commitment to reduce the amount you use your washer!

**Air pillow packing


**Batteries - alkaline and rechargeable batteries (e.g., AA, AAA, and D batteries)
