NVQ March BOM Black & White & Bright


Fabrics Black/white(dark) White/black(light) Solid bright – any color


Make Half Log Cabin block

- Cut 2 ¹/₂inch x 2 ¹/₂inch square solid bright 2 ¹/₂ inch strips – dark and light
- Sew Alternate dark/light or light/dark strips around colored square as in diagram

Finished block should be 10 1/2 inches square
