Advancing Equity and Inclusion

On November 24th, a team of NWTU members attended the *Advancing Equity and Inclusion in our Schools and Communities* workshop at the NWSS library. During this training, participants learned about barriers faced by equity seeking groups and strategies for creating a more inclusive union environment. In the afternoon, *Equity and Inclusion Chair, Satnam Sangra, and Social Justice Chair, Bertha Lansdowne,* led participants in a discussion around identifying and implementing steps in improving equity and inclusion for all our members.

A follow-up training session has been organized for January 11, 2022. During this session, attendees will participate in the BCTF *Equity Audit* workshop. This workshop is designed to guide participants through the steps of an equity audit, including collecting data on current member diversity and brainstorming strategic changes to policies and procedures aimed at increasing member engagement.



This definition of equity-seeking is in alignment with the definition developed by the BCTF.



DID YOU KNOW?

Kwanzaa 2021

Created by Dr. Maulana Karenga in 1966, Kwanzaa is a holiday that celebrates family, culture and heritage. It is modeled after the first harvest celebrations in Africa. Kwanzaa is celebrated for seven days. It involves lighting one candle per day for seven days in a special candle holder called a **kinara.** Each candle represents an African cultural value:

- Umoja (Unity)
- Kujichagulia (Self-Determination)
- Ujima (Collective Work and Responsibility)
- Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics)
- Nia (Purpose)
- Kuumba (Creativity)
- Imani (Faith)
