Show Rules

Cowboy States Reining Horse Association

2017 CSRHA SHOW RULES

1. Eligibility

- A. ALL NRHA CLASSES: Both owner and rider must be a member of NRHA. NRHA membership forms available at the show office. NRHA Competition License is required for each horse entered in a NRHA class. Competition Licenses (providing horse ownership can be verified) and memberships can be processed at the show. Rookie & Green Reiners must have a valid NRHA membership but may show a horse without the restrictions of horse ownership.
- B. All NRHA members may renew or purchase their membership at a show. Non-Pro members may renew at a show, if they present their previous year Non-Pro card to the Show Secretary. New NRHA Non-Pro applicants must complete a NRHA Non-Pro Declaration and submit it with the NRHA Non-Pro fee, the completed NRHA membership application and NRHA membership dues prior to entering a NRHA Non Pro class.
- C. Youth entering the NRHA Non-Pro or NRHA Rookie classes must have Non-Pro status indicated on their NRHA youth cards.
- D. CSRHA memberships are not required for NRHA or CSRHA classes but are required if points are to be counted for CSRHA Year-End Awards.
- E. Any rider participating in a NRHA class or a division in which he/she, or the horse, is not eligible based on earnings or points is subject to disciplinary action and forfeiture of any and all prize money awards. It is the responsibility of the owner and/or rider participating in a class to check their eligibility prior to competing. Eligibility for NRHA classes is available on the NRHA website or if applicable, the NRHA Show Secretary. Please see the current NRHA Handbook for eligibility of classes.

2. Entries

- A. A judge's fee will be charged for each class according to NRHA rules. However, for those classes running concurrently only the highest applicable judge's fee will be charged.
- B. A late fee per entry may be charged for late registration.
- C. An Office Fee may be charged per horse per show.
- D. One rider may show up to three (3) horses per class.
- E. Exhibitors will not be allowed to pick up their assigned back numbers until all required membership cards, signatures, and licenses are on file at the show office. All fees must be paid at time of entry or have an open check on file with the show secretary.
- F. All fees and payments are in U.S. Dollars and are non-refundable.
- G. Ties: Will be determined by show management.

3. Returned Checks

- A. Returned checks shall be considered late payment and subject to any late fee penalties.
- 3. All returned checks are subject to a \$40.00 NSF charge.

4. Paybacks

- A. Prize money to be paid per NRHA payback percentages (See current NRHA Handbook) in all classes.
- B. Prize money will be made payable to the payback person listed on the entry form and will be mailed within 30 days after the show.
- C. No prize money will mailed without the payee's Social Security or Tax ID number on file with the show secretary

5. Working Order

A. Entries will close and be drawn in a timely manner.

6. Show Management - CSRHA Classes

- A. The Cowboy States Reining Horse Association is governed by the rules and specifications of the current NRHA and CSRHA rules and guidelines and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- B. Show management will retain 100% of the entry fee.
- C. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or rising out of, or incident to the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Show Management and their decision shall be final.
- D. Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries; disqualify riders or exhibitors; prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards or prizes without claim for damages; to change any course, to cancel any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors.
- E. Management or officials of any CSRHA show or event shall have the authority to require a member or non-member to leave or withdraw from that event for misconduct, unprofessional conduct or disrespect to the event committee, officials or others.
- F. In order to be eligible for year end awards, an exhibitor must show in at least half of the CSRHA Shows. Year end awards will be based on points earned at 4 or fewer shows.
- G. Previous CSRHA saddle winners are not eligible to win the trophy saddle again.



2017 GSRHA Glass Descriptions

Green Horse: Any *HORSE* with lifetime earnings of less than \$200.00 as of January 1st of the current year in any reining event. May use any legal bit or hackamore and may be ridden 1 or 2 handed at any time during the class. Horse ownership not required. To be judged by NRHA guidelines.

Rookie L2: Any non pro *RIDER* with lifetime earnings of less than \$1500.00 as of January 1st of the current year in any reining event, horse ownership not required, any legal bit. Horses are to be shown one handed. To be judged by NRHA guidelines.

<u>Green Reiner L2:</u> Any non pro *RIDER* with lifetime earnings of less than \$350.00 as of January 1st of the current year in any reining event. Horse ownership not required and may be ridden in any legal bit or hackamore. Simple lead changes are allowed. May be ridden with one or two hands at any time during the class. To be judged by NRHA guidelines.

<u>Short Stirrup – 10 & Under</u>: Open to any youth rider who is age 10 or under as of January 1 of the current year. Horse ownership is not required. There will be no penalty for holding on to the saddle with either hand and rider may ride with one or two hands on the reins at any time during the class.

Youth 13 & Under: Youth 13 and under as of January 1 of the current year.

Youth 14 – 18: Youth 14 – 18 as of January 1 of the current year.

Non Pro: Open to riders who do not receive remuneration for riding/training horses, any legal bit and shall be ridden one handed in the bridle. To be judged by NRHA guidelines.

Open: Any horse, any rider, any legal bit and shall be ridden one handed in the bridle. To be judged by NRHA guidelines.

NRHA Classes: These classes are approved by NRHA and will be held in accordance with the National Reining Horse Association rules and guidelines as stated in the current NRHA Handbook. NRHA memberships and Competition Licenses are required for the NRHA classes. To be judged per NRHA Handbook & Guidelines

<u>CLUB Classes:</u> Club memberships, NRHA memberships and Competition Licenses are not required for club classes. *HOWEVER*, CSRHA membership is required if competitor desires to compete for CSRHA year end awards for the current year.

Note: To qualify for CSRHA year-end awards, both owner and rider must be members of CSRHA prior to showing in the class for which they want points to count toward year-end. Points are not retroactive. Points are accumulated based on the "same horse/rider" combination throughout the current show season.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: For those of you belonging to more than one NRHA affiliate, you must designate which affiliate you want to represent in order to qualify for the Affiliate Championship Finals. This designation must be in to NRHA before August 1st of the current year. You can download the form from the NRHA web site at www.nrha.com. **Check the NRHA web site for NRHA Regional Affiliate Qualifying Classes.**

Well finally Jeth got some smarts on And figured that George knew his stuff He decided that fighting was poison And eventually snorted "Enough!"



Sample Reining Pattern

NRHA Reining Pattern 6

This is a description of each maneuver in Pattern 6, it is one of the thirteen patterns used by the National Reining Horse Association.



Horses may walk or trot to the center of arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting pattern.

Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

- 1. Complete four spins to the right. Hesitate.
- 2. Complete four spins to the left. Hesitate.
- 3. Beginning on the left lead, complete three circles to the left: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Change leads at the center of the arena.
- 4. Complete three circles to the right: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Change leads at the center of the arena.
- 5. Begin a large fast circle to the left but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a right rollback at least twenty feet from the wall or fence no hesitation.
- 6. Continue back around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the left side of the arena past the center marker and do a left rollback at least twenty feet from the wall or fence no hesitation.
- 7. Continue back around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a sliding stop at least twenty feet from the wall or fence. Back up at least ten feet. Hesitate to demonstrate the completion of the pattern. Rider must dismount and drop bridle to the designated judge.

Pat Gervais Perpetual Trophy

Pat & Dan Gervais were our first CSRHA members from Northwestern Montana. At first they shared a horse (Ima Docs High Fever), while taking lessons from Cameron Meissner and competing in Green Rider and Rookie. In 2008 Dan won the CSRHA Rookie Year-end Award.

At the end of 2008, Pat decided she wanted to show her own reining horse. She purchased a gelding, Mighty Mega Jac, aka "Bird" from Sean Alquist of Cody, WY.

Pat practiced and practiced when she was not busy working in the State of Montana Legislature. By the 2009 show season, Pat was ready to roll....and that she did. Pat was an accomplished English rider until reining came along.....she was hooked. In 2009, Pat and Bird were Year-End Champions for the CSRHA Rookie and Reserve Champion for CSRHA 2 Handed Green As Grass.

On a cold wintery day in 2010 things would abruptly change for Pat. She went outside and whistled for her beloved Bird and as he came running to his special friend, Bird slipped on the ice hitting his head and passed on to the great beyond. Pat was devastated, but being the animal lover and reining enthusiast that she was, Pat, Dan and Cameron ventured out horse shopping. immediately fell in love with a three year old gelding, Dunit With A Stranger aka 'Billy', but



not feeling experienced enough to ride a young horse in the show pen, she and Dan went back to sharing Ima Docs High Fever.

The following year, Pat became ill although she was still riding and showing some. After multiple tests and trips to the doctors in the northwest, Pat was diagnosed with a tumor of the spinal cord. Surgery was performed and the tumor was removed. But Pat's recovery did not go well and she passed away in July of that year.

Dunit With A Stranger has since gone on to win many NRHA awards as well as the CSRHA Non-Pro Derby Champion with his new owner, Mike Cassidy in the saddle. The pair are still being coached by Cameron Meissner.

The Cowboy States Reining Horse Association is proud and honored to remember Pat and her winning spirit with the CSRHA Rookie Champion perpetual trophy each year. The Pat Gervais Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the CSRHA member who obtains the highest individual score in a Rookie 2 club class at any of the 2017 NRHA shows sponsored by Cowboy States Reining Horse Association. This would include the Grasslands Market Slide in Douglas, WY on May 20, the Sheridan Slide in Sheridan, WY on June 4 and the Parker County Slide in Powell, WY on July 15. The name of the winner will be added to perpetual trophy, and a plaque commemorating the win will be awarded to the winner. As requested by the friends of Pat Gervais who donated the trophy, it will be displayed in a Cody business to be designated by the winner.
