CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: We've just sung about how Jesus is our precious Savior and the One we will trust forever. But before we can see Jesus as our Savior, we have to understand what that Word of God tells us with regard to our failings and shortcomings, our disobedience and sin before God, so we can see what Jesus saved us from. So, join with me as we confess our sins to our holy God.
- C: Holy, Triune God, at this time of joy, we harbor feelings of guilt. Individually, we are responsible for holding sinful emotions of anger, worry, deceit and indifference. On countless occasions, they have become evident in words and actions which are unbecoming and ungodly. We ask for your forgiveness, O Lord. Even as your people, we have often argued and fought over minor matters and have forgotten the reason why we exist—to proclaim Jesus Christ and the good news of the cross. For this we ask your merciful pardon.

WORD OF FORGIVENENSS

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

⁸Listen, my son, to your father's instruction and do not forsake your mother's teaching. ⁹ They are a garland to grace your head and a chain to adorn your neck. ¹⁰ My son, if sinful men entice you, do not give in to them. ¹¹ If they say, "Come along with us; let's lie in wait for innocent blood. let's ambush some harmless soul; ¹² let's swallow them alive, like the grave, and whole, like those who go down to the pit; ¹³ we will get all sorts of valuable things and fill our houses with plunder; ¹⁴ cast lots with us: we will all share the loot"-¹⁵ my son, do not go along with them, do not set foot on their paths; ¹⁶ for their feet rush into evil, they are swift to shed blood. ¹⁷ How useless to spread a net where every bird can see it! ¹⁸ These men lie in wait for their own blood: they ambush only themselves! ¹⁹ Such are the paths of all who go after ill-gotten gain; it takes away the life of those who get it.

Luke 22:1-6 (EHV)

The Festival of Unleavened Bread, which is called the Passover, was approaching. ² The chief priests and the experts in the law were trying to find some way to put Jesus to death, because they were afraid of the people. ³ Then Satan entered Judas, called Iscariot, who was one of the Twelve. ⁴ He went away and spoke with the chief priests and officers of the temple guard about how he could betray Jesus to them. ⁵ They were glad and agreed to give him money. ⁶ He promised to do it and was looking for an opportunity to betray Jesus to them away from the crowd.


1 Corinthians 10:1-13 (EHV)

For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud and all passed through the sea, ² and they were all baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. ³ They all ate the same spiritual food ⁴ and all drank the same spiritual drink, for they drank from the spiritual rock that accompanied them-and that rock was Christ! ⁵ Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them. He had them die in the wilderness. ⁶Now these things took place as examples to warn us not to desire evil things the way they did. ⁷ Do not become idolaters like some of them—as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink, and got up to celebrate wildly." ⁸ And let us not commit sexual immorality, as some of them did, and in one day twenty-three thousand fell. ⁹Let us not put Christ to the test, as some of them did, and so were being destroyed by the serpents. ¹⁰ And do not grumble, as some of them grumbled, and were destroyed by the destroyer. ¹¹ All these things that were happening to them had meaning as examples, and they were written down to warn us, to whom the end of the ages has come. ¹² So let him who thinks he stands be careful that he does not fall. ¹³ No testing has overtaken you except ordinary testing. But God is faithful. He will not allow you to be tested beyond your ability, but when he tests you, he will also bring about the outcome that you are able to bear it.
