Did you know? ... since late April 2019, offensives and bombardments in north-west Syria, especially in Idlib, have escalated. The United Nations have reported that since 1 December 2019, more than 948,000 people have been forced to flee their homes. Sixty per cent - around 569,000 - of those newly displaced are children. The freezing weather is putting lives at risk, with several children reported to have died because of the cold weather. Thanks to the compassion and generosity of Catholics across England and Wales, CAFOD's partners are providing vital emergency aid – food, shelter and medical care – to vulnerable families both inside Syria and in neighbouring countries.
