September: Changing Seasons by Denise Semion

For many, Labor Day Weekend marks the end of summer and thoughts of cooler weather. And although the autumn equinox on the 22<sup>nd</sup> marks the official change of seasons, September reminds us to ready for winter.

As you tend to your flowerbeds and any vegetable plantings, you might consider one item in your kitchen that can be added to your soil: coffee grounds. Many gardeners like to add used coffee grounds as mulch for their plants. Used coffee grounds can also keep slugs and snails away from plants. The theory is that the caffeine in the coffee grounds negatively affects these pests and so they avoid soil where the coffee grounds are found. Fresh coffee grounds are acidic. Used coffee grounds are neutral. If you rinse your used coffee grounds, they will have a near neutral pH of 6.5 and will not affect the acid levels of the soil. 

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
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
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### Enjoy this cinnamon roll casserole for a yummy, easy breakfast:

### Ingredients:

- 2 cans Cinnamon rolls
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup heavy whipping cream
- 3 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp nutmeg
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans



### Serves 6-8

- 1. In a large glass bowl, melt butter with sugar.
- 2. Beat in eggs, cream, cinnamon, nutmeg and vanilla.
- 3. Open canned cinnamon rolls, slice each cinnamon roll into fourths. Place cinnamon roll pieces into the bowl of egg mixture and toss to thoroughly coat. Then pour the pieces, coated in egg mixture, into a greased 9×12 casserole dish and spread out evenly. Use any leftover egg mixture to coat the casserole.
- 4. Sprinkle with pecans and then bake on 350° on a low rack for 35-40 minutes or until brown (I stuck a toothpick inside to determine if the casserole was ready. I like mine a little on the moist side, baked for about 35 minutes.)

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
