



IN LEGEND, LT. JAMES COOK & Sir Joseph Banks were exploring Australia after the *HMS Endeavour* ran aground on the Great Barrier Reef. Seeing a strange animal, they asked the native Guugu Yimithirr people for the name of the animal. The response was "gangurru." Cook & Banks thought this meant "I don't know," & it took until 1972 for the etymology to be corrected. The kangaroo is the largest marsupial (pouched) & macropod (large-foot) & the largest animal that uses hopping as its main means of locomotion. Kangaroos can travel at 30 MPH & can cover 42 feet in a single hop, which is why a speedy trial, jumping to a predetermined conclusion, is termed a kangaroo court.

KANGAROOS M JUSTICE: The United States Department of Justice was formed this week in 1870, signed into law by President Ulysses S. Grant. Up until this time, the Attorney General (who advised the President & Congress on legal matters & argued cases before the Supreme Court) ran a very lean shop. During the Civil War, at a time when Abraham Lincoln often exercised his Presidential war powers (such as suspending the Writ of Habeas Corpus), Attorney General Edward Bates had just six attorneys on his staff! Today the DOJ includes the FBI, ATF, DEA, U.S. Marshals, the U.S. prison system & has thousands & thousands of attorneys across the country. The department now has about 120K employees! One of the main purposes of the DOJ is to be a legal & law enforcement watchdog – to assure equal justice under law, the words inscribed on the façade of the Supreme Court building. Equal justice, protection, treatment under law is guaranteed – to USA citizens – under the 14th Amendment to the USA Constitution. The 14th Amendment is in place to assure that no matter a person's race, religion, creed, gender, political views or opinions, that we are a society governed by laws applied equally to each citizen. In totalitarian societies (the socialist, communist & fascist societies that all spring from the same root that a single person or a central ruling elite hold all power & make all decisions for everyone) the law - & justice are not applied equally. These regimes use the media to target individuals or groups. They use law enforcement to spy, harass & abuse honest law-abiding citizens. They use the brainwashed, coerced, masses to ostracize & intimidate the dissenters. They use the legal system & their institutions to mainstream perversity. And they use their Kangaroo Courts to leap to foregone conclusions & eliminate their social & political enemies. Lavrentiy Beria, Josef Stalin's secret police chief, summed up everything one needs to know about how totalitarian regimes operate with this comment: "Show me the man & I'll show you the crime." The 14th Amendment protects everyone, no matter who they are, from the overreach of the justice system or government, requiring the law be applied fairly. Often, this is not the case – the guilty go unpunished, the innocent get charged & justice is applied unfairly. Eleanor Roosevelt reminds us, "Justice cannot be for one side alone, but must be for both." A truly just society is ruled by laws, not by the whims of law enforcement, prosecutors, politicians, causes-de-jour or their wealthy donors. From Aristotle, "At his best, man is the noblest of all animals; separated from law & justice he is the worst." Laws applied unequally hurt everyone in society; from Publilius Syrus, "He who spares the bad injures the good." George Washington believed that equal justice was a governmental mandate: "The due administration of justice is the firmest pillar of good government, I have considered the first arrangement of the judicial department as essential to the happiness of the country & to the stability of its political system." And while we need good government to enforce laws, we see what can happen in totalitarian states. From Pascal, "Justice without force is powerless; force without justice is tyrannical." Justice applied equally not only prevents tyranny, it prevents anarchy; as Edmund Burke shares, "Justice is itself the great standing policy of civil society; any imminent departure from it, under any circumstances, lies under the suspicion of being no policy at all." Each & every citizen should want equal justice, for the safeguard of both society & their family; & expect it from our governing institutions. From Plato, "Justice in the life & conduct of the State is possible only as first it resides in the hearts & souls of the citizens." And justice for all should be the goal of any decent society; for as President John Adams said, "Let justice be done though the heavens should fall."

INDUSTRY NEWS: Hawaii Volcanic Water raised \$10M with L.A. Libations involved. Tony Chocoloney raised €20M from existing investors. Energy drink brand Gorgie raised \$6.5M from private investors. DTC baby product brand Lalo raised \$10.1M led by Spin Master Ventures with participation from Babylist & 35V. Los Angeles-based startup Omeat emerged

from stealth, raising \$40M. British startup Adamo Foods raised £1.5M in pre-seed funding from SFC Capital & grants from government agency Innovate UK for its whole-cut mycelium steaks. VFC will buy UK vegan meat company Meatless, preventing *Meatless*'s impending bankruptcy. *Foodomarket*, French B2B food marketplace for the hospitality industry, raised \$9.5M led by Alven Capital. Food tech startup BetterBrand raised a \$6M Series A funding round at a pre-money \$170M valuation led by VERSO Capital with participation from Gaingels Fund, Seven Seven Six, Craft Lane & others. Guardian Agriculture raised \$20M led by Fall Line Capital to expand its autonomous drone technology to farms across the USA. Brown-Forman will sell the vodka brand Finlandia to Coca-Cola HBC AG for \$220M. Ferraro Foods, specialty distributors of food & supplies to pizzerias & Italian restaurants, acquired New Jersey-based GDS Foods Inc., an importer & distributor of Italian food for pizzerias. Pacific Coast Fruit Company, produce distributor, acquired King Harvest Hummus. Japanese food service company Zensho Holdings purchased The Snowfox Group for \$621M from Mayfair Equity Partners. Japanese bakery Taquchi & Co. acquired artisanal New York baking company Brooklyn Brands, a subsidiary of Astor Group; terms not disclosed. Arbor Investments acquired Golden Malted & Heartland Waffles companies from Roch Capital; terms not disclosed. UK PE firm IK Partners acquired frozen snack foods brand GoodLife Foods. PepsiCo's Pioneer Foods bought the remaining 50% stake of South African nutritional cereal brand Future Life Health Products. Toronto ecommerce platform Local Line acquired Forager, a platform that connects local food producers & retailers. Express delivery platform Getir will exit the French market & is seeking a buyer for all or part of its French business. Oregon-based BranchOut Food, fruit-drying tech, raised \$7.1M in a Nasdaq IPO while securing a distribution deal with Walmart. From Silverwood Partners, ghost kitchen funding more than doubled to \$1.7B from 2019 to 2022, but has dried up through May of this year. From Rabobank, after a dozen years of increased investment in innovative food products, investment is recent years in declining; suggesting a tapering in food innovation.

Aldi opened 3 stores - Tempe, AZ; Miami; & St. Mary's, PA. Dollar General opened its first store in Montana. Lowes has 5 new stores planned in North & South Carolina. Another Amazon Go location has closed in Seattle. A new Caper Cart smart cart will be used at Wakefern stores, slimmer & holding 65% more items than the previous model. Kroger will donate \$10B in meals through 2025. HEB opened a Plano, TX, eCommerce fulfillment center. Natural Grocer expanded its private label brand with sparkling water in an aluminum can. Coca-Cola's launched BodyArmor Flash I.V, rapid hydration, the brand's first new major product launch in 2 years. SunOpta & Seven Sundays have launched Oat Protein Cereal a byproduct from SunOpta's oat milk production. Boursin launched Black Truffle & Sea Salt cheese for a limited time. Spain's HEVO Group launched Ouvegg, a vegan egg alternative made with chickpea & flax flour. Impossible Foods launched a higher fat & calorie version of its flagship burger. Nestlè subsidiary Tivall will launch clean label meat alternatives made from pumpkin & sunflower seeds with Israel-based More Foods. Café Valley invested \$5M+ in its Marion, IN, baking plant, adding high-speed production equipment & adding 83 jobs. Following a trend, restaurant ordering software startup Olo cut 11% of its workforce as did Singapore-based food delivery app GrabFood, cutting 1K jobs. Firehouse Subs will expand internationally to Switzerland & Mexico. Carbon Robotics announced that its LaserWeeder has been named best AI-based agriculture solution by the AI Breakthrough Awards. From Treehouse Foods leadership, the company will change its focus from cost cutting to growth. From Food Navigator, Kraft Heinz will invest in marketing as opposed to price cuts to address falling sales volume. France has asked 75 CPG companies, including Danone & Kellogg, to cut consumer prices. NYC grocers are upset on a proposed law that will ban facial recognition to stop shoplifting & crime. Canada Bread Co. was fined C\$50M after pleading guilty for its role in an industry-wide pricefixing scandal with certain packaged bread products.

From *dunnhumby*, *Lidl*, *Food 4 Less*, *Aldi*, *Costco*, Kroger-owned *Fry's*, *Amazon*, *BJ's Wholesale Club*, *H-E-B*, *Shoprite* & *WinCo* are best positioned for long-term growth in the grocery industry. From *Wells Fargo* & *Rabobank*, government policy induced inflation will make America's Fourth of July celebrations more expensive than last year. From *Deloitte*, 55% of restaurant customers say they are dining in restaurants more often than before government mandated lockdowns, 40% want less pricey options & 40% of take-out customers prefer ordering on the restaurants website with only 13% using third-party apps. Truckload freight volumes rose slightly in May & national average rates were stable for a second straight month, per *DAT Freight & Analytics*. Peruvian blueberry production grew 37.5% in 1st QTR.
