RETREATS

We have two retreats coming up in the Lancaster area at the retreat houses owned by Burkholders Fabrics.


The first is LABOR DAY WEEKEND...Thursday August 31 through Sunday, September 3. We have 4 openings for private rooms with private baths at \$60 per night. We could also accommodate people who don't mind sharing a bathroom (Jack and Jill set-up with the bathroom shared between two bedrooms) at \$50/night.

The other retreat is March 15-18, 2018 and there are currently two openings and either of the above set ups is available to take more people but at the same cost. If you are willing to share your bedroom you would have to arrange your own roommate. As this is NOT a guild sponsored event you can invite non-guild members at the same price.

Additionally each house has a \$175 cleaning fee which will be split evenly by the total number of attendees. We share all meals with two or more people doing the prep and cooking. No one is responsible for more than one meal. We are also very sensitive to special food need that people may have. A signup sheet for meals is sent out approximately 4-6 weeks ahead of the retreat for food assignments.


