

When we read the ancient stories of the Bible, God's relationship to humanity seems to change depending upon historical events. God can be perceived as a remote almighty being separate from creation and human life. Then at times God was a friend, helper who understood the sufferings of the chosen people and sought to lead them by safe paths through the chosen leaders. Then again as in the first reading God could sound angry and frustrated with the foolish actions of His people and threaten to bring havoc upon them.

When teaching His disciples, Jesus urged them to address God as "Abba"- Our - not My - Father.

The brotherly attitude of Jesus to tax collectors, sinners, women... scandalized those who saw themselves as guardians and keepers of the sacred traditions, the Torah and religious observances. In their view, sinners and all dubbed unclean - even for offences committed against them rather than by them - were outcasts from society and from God and so was anyone who befriended them. In Jesus' view, it was the critics who had separated the outcasts and in doing so had in a sense separated themselves from the God who was the Loving Creator/ Father of all creation, of each person in the human family.

Today's Gospel records Jesus' response through three parables. We hear God described as a shepherd who leaves behind a flock of sheep to search for a lost one when he finds it he rejoices not alone but with the community.

The second is about a poor woman who cannot stop searching until she finds a lost coin of the same precious value to her as others. Finally we come to the most known parable of all - itself a gospel within a gospel. The father runs out to welcome home - with great display of affection and gratitude- an errant son who had demanded a share of the family fortune, left home, lived recklessly and suffered to the point of starvation.

As the shepherd who found his sheep didn't ask how it came to be lost, neither did the father waste time questioning the son.

Both shepherd and father simply rejoice in being reunited with what they had lost, celebrating with all.



On Safeguarding Sunday, the Gospel reminds us how attentive we should be to people in need, including those who have separated themselves from the community. It indicates, too, the level of care we ought to have for children in the Church and the seriousness with which we should observe the safeguards. The Parable of the Prodigal Son also points to our special responsibility to seek out and welcome people who have been abused as children in the Church. Any financial in compensating them for the abuse they have suffered while in the church's care is insignificant compared to the gain if they again find a home in Christ's church. The Gospel is about bigheartedness. (Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ, Safeguarding Sunday)


† † † Finishing Well Forum

GOSPEL

Luke 15:1-32

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance.

'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

He also said, 'A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me." So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery.

'When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks the pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, "How many of my father's paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father.

While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly. Then his son said, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found." And they began to celebrate.

'Now the elder son was out in the fields, and on his way back, as he drew near the house, he could hear music and dancing. Calling one of the servants he asked what it was all about. "Your brother has come" replied the servant "and your father has killed the calf we had fattened because he has got him back safe and sound." He was angry then and refused to go in, and his father came out to plead with him; but he answered his father, "Look, all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed your orders, yet you never offered me so much as a kid for me to celebrate with my friends. But, for this son of yours, when he comes back after swallowing up your property - he and his women - you kill the calf we had been fattening."

'The father said, "My son, you are with me always and all I have is yours. But it was only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found."
