Every time you turn on the news someone's life has been violently taken. It's happening all across our nation. We're even seeing more mass shootings occurring in schools, businesses, stores, parties, etc. Too many people today don't understand the value of a life.

There was a 16-year-old young man, who was excelling in school and was kind to everyone, who was murdered less than two weeks ago while playing basketball at a Youngstown park. There are local residents of that park who say they won't go to that park, nor will they permit their children to play in that park, due to the constant fighting and occasional shootings.

This shouldn't surprise us because Jesus told us things would be as the days of Noah in the last days (Matthew 24:37). When God had no

One theologian made this comment regarding the gnat and camel illustration, "The Jews had a law that forbade eating any flying insects that did not have jointed legs for hopping (Leviticus 11:20-23), and in this they were strictly observant. Because water could have insects and insect larvae in it, pious Jews were careful to strain the water through a cloth before drinking it. They did not want to accidentally ingest an unclean insect and thus violate the law. Jesus mentions this practice in His proverb and then contrasts it with a hyperbolic picture of gulping down a camel. In this way, Jesus accused them of taking great pains (straining out gnats) to avoid offence in minor things of little importance, while tolerating or committing great sins (swallowing camels) such as deceit, oppression, and lust."

In essence Jesus was accusing these "theologians" of pursuing Rightness rather than seeking Righteousness. Let's be clear, there are not big sins and little sins, but we must be careful that in biblically criticizing sinners we judge ourselves by the same measure by which we judge them (Matthew 7:1-5).

In our current American culture Christians are being bombarded with social and moral issues that challenge us to take a firm and inflexible position and fight at all costs to assure that our side prevails. Now, without a doubt, we must be people of conviction and tenacity who will not

compromise the truths of God's word. There is surely a time to fight. But we must not forget that scripture tells us that "the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses." (2 Corinthians 10:4)

Jesus seldom rebuked the Pharisees for their knowledge of and reference to the law. Jesus Himself came to fulfill the law through His life of total surrender to the will of the Father. The primary problem of these religious leaders was their selective application of the law.

They proudly used the law as a pedestal from which they could judge and condemn others. Instead of using God's truth to heal and guide the hearer, they used the law to promote their own selfish agendas. In many cases they were "right" but it is obvious that their rightness was not seated in righteousness.

The Pharisees were right in their application of the Levitical law in dealing with the woman caught in the act of adultery (John 8:3-11). But while not questioning the accuracy of their interpretation of the law, Jesus went beyond the letter of the law to express the spirit of the law in granting grace and forgiveness to the convicted sinner.

The sinister spirit of Pharisaism has now raised its ugly head in the midst of evangelicalism in America as it seems that many believers have edited Christ words in Matthew 6:33 where He says, "... But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness

In describing the kingdom of God, Paul wrote in Romans 14:17 "For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit."

In our passionate zeal for God's glory to fill the earth let's make sure that our eye is on the right prize. The goal is Righteousness and not Rightness. Our calling is not to win the tough arguments ... our assignment is to win lost souls.

Righteousness enlightens while rightness can blind. Righteousness informs while rightness blames. Righteousness forgives while rightness condemns. Righteousness unites while rightness divides. The height of righteousness was Mount Calvary while the height of rightness was Mount Sinai. Finally, it's possible to be right and go to hell but if you have the righteousness of Christ, heaven is your destination.

Build your life and your ministry on righteousness and not rightness. Paul wrote in Romans 1:16-17, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it [the gospel] the RIGHTEOUSNESS OF GOD is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, 'The just shall live by faith.'"
