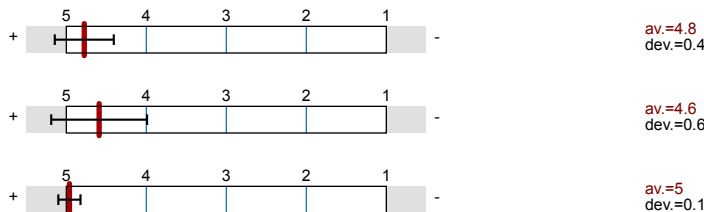

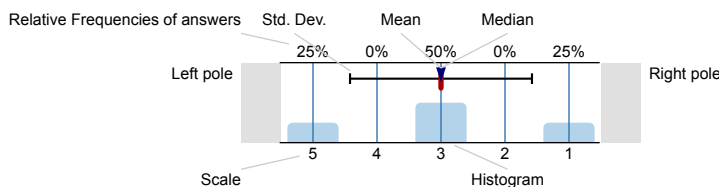

- Professor Scauso creates a learning environment that is a space that allows for students to excel, feel comfortable to express their thoughts and connect the learning objectives to the world around them. This is because the way that each class is structured connects with students emotional temperature making sure they are comfortable and also giving clear, detailed slides information.
