BELVOIR CASTLE 26 APRIL 2021

Thank you to all those WIs who have sent in the Interest Form. We are pleased to let you know that a visit and tour of Belvoir Castle has been arranged for Monday 26 April 2021. If enough members want to go we can organise 2 coaches, one going from Doncaster and the second from Sheffield. If not, one coach will be arranged with 2 pick up points. Arriving in advance of the tour at 11 am, we will spend the full day here, leaving at approximately 4 pm. The cost of the Guided Tour and access to the gardens is £16.20. Details of the cost of the coach(es) will be determined when we know how many people would like to visit; however, it is hoped that this will cost members no more than £20 (in addition to the admission price).

Belvoir Castle is a great place to visit, it dates back to the 11th Century, a guided tour of the Castle will be included and there are also gardens and lakes to explore with plenty of retail therapy opportunities too in the Engine Yard Retail Park! Local food, artisan shopping and the best of country living from the latest fashions and accessories to homewares, crafts and toys. There is also a restaurant and tea room.

Due to the nature of the property disabled access is unfortunately limited, the Castle ground floor is accessible, without ramps or slopes. The entrance door is 80cm wide. Wheelchair users



may access the Guard room, Portico, Castle kitchens, Pastry room, Gift shop and Tea rooms. There is no lift inside.

To secure your place, a £5 non refundable deposit is required by 30 June.

There are two main thrusts to the work of ACWW. Its advocacy work via the United Nations and its projects work. ACWW has consultative status on several UN committees. Since 1977, ACWW has funded small-scale development projects around the world that benefit women and their communities. However, ACWW receives no government funding to support this work. It relies on its membership fees, legacies and donations for its income alongside the Pennies for Friendship Fund (PfF). The concept of the Pennies for Friendship scheme was developed in the 1930s and its premiss was that if "every member contributed 1 small coin, in addition to their official subscriptions, ACWW would have a secure and comfortable income without causing hardship to those supporters". So SYFWI, as a member society, has an obligation to contribute to this fund, however small this donation may be. More about how PfF supports the projects work next time.

The NFWI Board of Trustees has decided to put forward the two top resolutions to the Annual Meeting.

The wordings of the resolutions are as follows:

A call to increase potential stem cell donor registration

Wording: There is an urgent need to increase the number of people registered on the aligned UK stem cell registry in order to provide potentially life-saving treatment to people of all ages with certain blood cancers. We call on all WI members to promote registration to the database to avoid people dying whilst waiting for a match.

End Modern Slavery

Wording: There are tens of thousands of victims of modern slavery hiding in plain sight in the UK. Modern slavery has severe consequences for the health and mental wellbeing of survivors. The NFWI calls on Government to protect victims of modern slavery in the first instance and deliver longer term support to help them rebuild their lives. We call on our members to raise awareness of the prevalence of modern slavery throughout society and to campaign to defeat it.


Next steps – voting

WIs should now consider how they wish their delegate to vote at the Annual Meeting in London 4th June. All WIs get one vote per resolution – for or against. This means WIs shouldn't vote for one resolution over the other, but should vote for or against each one independently. If both resolutions are passed at the AM, the NFWI will work on both issues.

WIs may choose to give their delegate discretion to decide how to vote after hearing the speakers' presentations for and against the resolution and the debate at the Annual Meeting. Please ensure your WI makes it clear to your delegate whether you are granting her discretion.

WIs and federations are also encouraged to hold discussion events in to allow members to consider how they wish their delegate to vote.

IN MEMORY OF LUCY BARKER 1930 - 2020

HIGH LEVELS WI

Lucy passed away peacefully on 13 February after a full life of dedication to family and friends and in particular to the WI movement.

She was a farmer's wife in the Isle of Axholme and a long standing member of High Levels WI and the Vermuyden Group.

High Levels WI was formed in 1947 and Lucy joined at an early stage as one of the younger members and soon became a member of the committee rising to President.

Leading on from her success at the local level she was invited to join the Yorkshire County Committee which met in York and became a VCO (Voluntary County Organiser) which took her all over the county setting up WIs in little villages and giving advice. She enjoyed her time within the large Federation but in 1983 NFWI decided that the Yorkshire Federation was too big and the decision was taken to split Yorkshire into five separate Federations and South Yorkshire Federation was formed in 1983. It gave the opportunity to many small villages to form their own WI, with the headquarters in Doncaster, which made access to the Headquarters much more convenient.

Lucy became a founder member of the South Yorkshire Federation committee and became Chairman of the Public Affairs Committee. She continued her work as a VCO and helped many new WIs to be formed in South Yorkshire.

She was very influential in those early days of the new South Yorkshire committee helping to run big County events etc, but still keeping a major interest in High Levels.

High Levels WI met in a local school (the Black Bull Primary School) until it closed down and Lucy offered the games room in her home, Sand Hall, for WI meetings. She moved to a smaller home, Charity Farm, in 1996 and the WI moved with her into a converted garage. She became High Levels President for some time and for the rest of her life was an enthusiastic supporter of WI life both local and in the County, retaining an active interest in crafts, music (founder member of the Vermuyden WI Choir) and themed fancy dress events!

Her supportive influence and commitment to the WI will be appreciated for many years to come.

Yorkshire WI Recipe Book

RECIPE CORNER

Ouseburn WI doesn't seem to be running now unfortunately, I can't find any information about them on NFWI. However, Ouseburn is situated on the edge of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

Ham and Potato Ríng

Ingredients:

1 ¼ lbs of Mashed Potato A little finely chopped parsley 1 egg 1 ¹/₂ pint White or cheese sauce
6 oz Chopped Ham
2 hard boiled eggs
Sliced tomatoes or olives to garnish

Method:

Add eggs and parsley to the potato and pipe or pile into a ring shape. Stir ham into sauce and add one chopped hard boiled egg. Pile in the centre of the ring and put in the oven Regulo 7 or mark 450 F to heat. Garnish with sliced hard boiled egg, sliced tomatoes or olives.

Please remember that these recipes are from a pre 1983 book and so you need to check the temperatures and measures.
