Primitive Muzzleloading Hunting Seasons

I'd like to pass on an email I received recently from a fellow muzzleloader with concerns on hunting seasons. I know this subject is near and dear to many of you. Is there interest in getting this changed? You can post your comments to the new facebook page.

Greetings,

I am writing to find out more about your organization. It is my understanding that you are the voice of the muzzleloader hunter for the WDFW.

I am a traditional muzzleloader hunter who has watched the WDFW basically destroy our sport. Over the course of the past several years adapting rule changes to accommodate modern inline muzzleloaders. Most recently allowing 209 primers and eliminating the language that required caps to be exposed to the elements. Since allowing inline muzzleloaders and all of the rule changes it has caused the harvest rate to drastically increase. Which has resulted in our hunting season to be reduced to a mere 9 days. Meanwhile modern rifle hunters get 11 days.

I am currently in an email exchange with the WDFW expressing my disgust with their failure to make a distinction between modern inline muzzleloaders and traditional black powder muzzleloaders. They are completely different methods with no comparison to the functionality and performance and should be in a separate category. I have asked the WDFW to explain their justification for giving a modern rifle hunter 11 days to deer hunt and a primitive black powder hunter only 9 days. So far they have failed to provide a coherent answer. Only a form letter response about herd size and harvest quotas.

I'm not sure how your organization feels about this issue. I am seeking fellow traditional muzzleloader hunters who are prepared to challenge the WDFW and fight to save our sport. We should not be in the same hunting method category as inline muzzleloaders and certainly should not receive fewer days to hunt than a modern rifle hunter. We need our own "Primitive" hunting category separate from inlines and modern rifles.

Brian,

Thanks for your email. Many people in the WSMA have expressed the same frustration. While the WSMA supports all muzzleloading activities, almost all of the 100 or so members lean toward the more primitive style of shooting and hunting. In fact, after trying to get more of the modern muzzleloaders in the organization, I'm convinced they just aren't interested. But back to your concerns.

The focus for the last several years has been supporting the various black powder clubs with their youth programs. This has been quite successful. The main reason we as an organization are not pursuing the primitive hunting seasons is that we don't have anyone with the knowledge of how to make the changes or the willingness to take on the issue. I've talked with one individual (a hunter's ed instructor) who said he would be willing interested to tackle this, but needs to get out of some of his other commitments before he can dedicate time toward this.

With your permission I'd like to pass on the text of your letter in our next newsletter, to see what kind of support is out there and perhaps find a willing ally or two. Thanks for voicing your concern

Thank you for the reply. I'm glad to hear your organization has a strong youth program.

Yes please pass along my email to anyone interested. For whatever reason the WDFW has completely over looked traditional muzzleloaderhunters for the past several years. I know there aren't many of us left. The original purpose of having a separate muzzleloader category was to offer the primitive hunters a fair chance before the modern rifle hunters each season. The newer in-lines feature a waterproof ignition and accuracy to 300 yards. Yet somehow the WDFW considers them equal to a primitive black powder muzzleloader. It is extremely unfair that we only get 9 days to hunt deer.

I look forward to hearing from others who feel the same. Hopefully we can put our heads together and figure out a good way to present our case to the new WDFW Director.
