Letter from the President

The way too short summer has come to an end. I am sure, however, that many will welcome the cooler air that Fall promises. If you followed us on Facebook and CH-CA. org, you would have seen a lot of activities at the park, the heart of our community. I thank Caitlin Huden of Crescent Hills Rd. and David DeJohn of Verona who hosted Readings in the Park; Tracey Salah of

Sycamore Drive who taught Yoga every Saturday morning; and Bob and Geri MacBeth of Garlow Drive who set up volleyball each Monday evening for the athletes among us. Many of you walk your dog, run, or walk on the gravel path as your children play in the playground. Much community activity occurs there, including the upcoming Fall Fest. Our park is funded by resident donations, but the cost of running the park has become more expensive each year. The rising cost is primarily due to very old and large trees falling apart in storms requiring professional tree services – this year-to-date adding \$3,200 to our budget. Last year, tree removal was \$4,643.

Other devoted volunteers like David Fraser, Judy and Tom Conroy, and Bob Shaner and maybe even you, to mention a few, have saved the park budget many dollars by providing their skilled assistance. We have reached the end of the reserve fund. On a positive note, we are currently planning a Holiday House Tour, which should provide some reserve funds. However, we need more than this.

Even if you do not use the park, its presence, in its immaculate condition, has increased your property values. Real estate agents say they have waiting lists for folks wanting to buy in Crescent Hills. If you have not donated to the park yet this year, please do so. If you've never contributed, consider doing so now. If you want to increase your contribution, that is welcome also. Remembering the joy it has brought to you and your family, consider putting Crescent Hills Park in your will. We extend our condolences to Sean McCormick of Spring Grove Road on the death of his father, and to the family of Rich Vignovich, formerly of Glenfield Drive.


Get well wishes go out to Mimi Marko-Eberle, Spring Grove Road, and to Jean Meyer, Crescent Hills Road.

Code violations come in a variety of forms. Some of them include Tall Grass and Weeds (over 10 inches); Trash and Debris on private property; Insect, Rodent and Mosquito infestations; Substandard and Dangerous Buildings; Illegal Residential Business; Junked or Abandoned Cars on public roadways and private properties; and many others. Our municipality's website has more details regarding code violations. Trash Can Reminder: Garbage should be placed at the curb no earlier than 4pm the day before pickup and containers should be removed from the curb and placed out of view from the street by midnight the day of pickup. This past winter the corner garden took a hard hit when a car ran through it. It tore 75% of the wall down, scattering the stones across the lawn behind it. We had to wait till spring and the ground thawed before we could rebuild. Luckily the stones were all in good shape and it just took a few hours to dig the space and replace the stones.

During our summer maintenance, we received permission to take out an overgrown tree behind the wall. Now the corner is clear and provides better visibility.

Fall planting just took place. We added some red and yellow mums to the still blooming zinnias along with some mulch. Bill did a little clean up along the street and storm drain as well.

We take a lot of pleasure in the beautiful corner garden and when working on it, we always have people stopping to comment and thank us for the upkeep.

PARK NEWS

The CHCA received \$50,000 in federal stimulus funds through Penn Hills in early March.

While the money has been earmarked to improve the sports court at Crescent Hills Park, potential contractors are evaluating these factors:

- How to improve the rain drainage either with the present drain or the creation of a new system.
- Whether to upgrade the court surface with a new layer of asphalt or by filling cracks and using a special sealer.

The association is also considering:

- Whether to convert half of the space into a pickleball court to take advantage of the popular sport.
- If there is enough money to replace the fence surrounding the court, which has many problems.

These and other variables are still being studied.

While those decisions were being pondered, life in the park went on through spring and summer. Many neighbors used the greenspace for yoga class, a reading program for children, ball games, walking and picnics.

Bob Macbeth, who organizes adult volleyball on Mondays, thanks the "newcomers" who joined the regulars this year. He reminds neighbors that volleyball will continue on Mondays through September, although games will start at 5 pm. instead of 6 p.m.

This season, neighborhood volunteers took many steps to improve the appearance and safety of the park. Those include:

- Pressure-washing the peaceful kingdom (the former basketball court) to make it less slippery.
- Spreading 15 yards of playground mulch to keep play areas safe.
- Stabilizing the merry-go-round (Thank you Bob Shaner).
- Weeding and mulching garden areas.
- Planting deer resistant (?!?) flowers in the gardens.
- Pruning bushes and trees to clear the left side of the walking trail (Thanks, Dave Fraser).

- Although we all have leaves and yard debris throughout the fall, please don't dump yours at the park. We have plenty of our own.
- Please continue to use the park with care and respect throughout autumn and winter.
