Lecture on Irish Genealogy

At our May meeting, members of the Albuquerque Genealogical Society's (AGS) Celtic Special Interest Group (SIG) will present information on how to do basic research on finding your Irish roots and how to get started. AGS members Linda Koch (president) and John Farris (past president) will also cover all the newest DNA information that is coming out of Ireland, including how to use your DNA to connect to a specific place where your family is from in Ireland.

The AGS is a non-profit organization founded in 1972 that promotes genealogical research and provides information about methods for researching, collecting, compiling, sharing, and publishing family history/genealogy. The Celtic SIG meets at the second floor of the main library (downtown) on the last Tuesday of the month from 1:30 to 3 PM. The Irish Book Club



In March, we did something a little different and read a play—*The Ferryman* by Jez Butterworth. (We even did an out-loud reading of the play, thank you very much for setting it up, Kathy Wimmer, and had a blast doing lots of different parts.) Our book for April, which we're reading now, is *An Apology for Roses* by John Broderick.

The Ferryman, by Jez Butterworth

Armagh, 1981. The Carney farmhouse is a hive of activity with preparations for the annual harvest. A day of hard work on the land and a traditional night of feasting and celebrations lie ahead. But this year they will be interrupted by a visitor. Developed by Sonia Friedman Productions, *The Ferryman* premiered at the Royal Court Theatre, London, in April 2017, before transferring to the West End. The production was directed by Sam Mendes.

The play is now on Broadway, getting great reviews like this one from the *New York Times*: "No matter what sort of spread you've planned for your Thanksgiving dinner, it won't be a patch on the glorious feast that has been laid out at the Bernard B. Jacobs Theater. That's where Jez Butterworth's thrilling new play 'The Ferryman' opened on Sunday night, with a generosity of substance and spirit rarely seen on the stage anymore. There is, for the record, a whopping celebratory meal at the center of this endlessly



vibrant work, directed with sweeping passion and meticulous care by Sam Mendes. Its main course is a goose, which has figured as a living creature in earlier scenes, and the repast appears to be more than enough to feed the 17 revelers gathered at an overladen table in rural Northern Ireland in 1981. But the real sustenance provided here comes from the sheer abundance within a work that picked up most of the awards on offer during its London run last year. This is theater as charged and cluttered and expansive as life itself. And the three and a quarter hours and 21 speaking parts required to tell its story — which is at once a shivery suspenser, a hearthside family portrait, a political tragedy and a journey across mythic seas — barely seem long enough to contain all it has to give us."

Those of us who participated in the reading mostly agreed with this assessment, as did most of the American critics.

Critics from Northern Ireland were not so admiring, especially Sean O'Hagen, writing in *The Guardian*: "What makes me most uneasy about *The Ferryman* is the differences the play unconsciously highlights between Irish and English cultural sensibilities, between the Irish people's idea of themselves and the English idea of them. The attentiveness that ensued when Aunt Maggie sang a lovely Irish air – Yeats's fairy ode, "The Stolen Child" – was equally mystifying. The notions of Ireland these stereotypes evoke – a wild, unfettered place of terminal boozing and unfettered romanticism – seemed to have somehow endured despite the Troubles, the Celtic Tiger, and even the sudden dramatic appearance in the English psyche of the DUP, who, believe me, are more alarming than those banshees."

Nevertheless, we all agreed to plan a road trip to Broadway to see it. Anyone else want to come? ©


