

## Dedication of Roosevelt H.S. 1923

Friday, January 16, the formal dedication of Roosevelt High School took place. About fifteen hundred people attended. William A. Weber, president of the Board of Education, presided.

The program was very interesting and entertaining. It reads: Invocation, Rev. Fred L. Dennis, pastor of Euclid Avenue U.B. Church; song, "American;" presentation of building, President Weber; acceptance, superintendent, Paul C. Stetson; acceptance, principal, G.A. Morris; vocal solo, Mrs. Clara Turpen Grimes, accompanied by Mrs. Anna Cosley Wright; dedicatory address, Dr. William O. Thompson, president of Ohio State university; vocal solo Mary Goode Royal, accompanied by Henry A. Ditzel; benediction, Rev. W.S. Bell, pastor of the First Brethren church. All people attending the formal dedication program were invited to take a trip through the building, afterward.
