A that time they had sold over 15,000 copies of the game which had proven to be very effective in teaching children to read prior to their attending school. It is a game of matching 30 different word cards, without photos, that teaches the child to recognize each word. These 30 words are the only words that are used in a book that goes with those 30 words, allowing the child to read the story written with those words. Each game has five separate sets of matching words and a story. This allows the child to learn 150 words and read five books.

Brent's wife decided to reintroduce the game. Utilizing the advances in Computer technology and printing they have be able to efficiently reproduce the game at a lower cost of \$9.00/unit. It is sold to the stores for \$14 and the retail price is \$29. The game is available at Learning Express Stores, School House, and in the School Supply Catalog. Thanks Brent
