Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer! As always, I trust God that all is well with you and that you are continuing to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus.

Like the subtle changing of the seasons that has settled upon us, the community around United is also changing. Those changes include the 200-plus luxury apartment complex under construction on East 2nd Street, a few blocks from our front door. The new development provides opportunities for United to continue extending God's love in Plainfield in multiple ways to various demographics.

The vision begins with United's mission statement, a place "Where God is Exalted, Everyone Matters, and You Belong!" To bring that concept to fruition, United must collaborate with like-minded people and organizations whose primary objectives are to improve the quality of life for all people. To accomplish this, United needs each member and friend to use their combined considerable gifts to complete the task.

To move forward, I invite you to commit to meeting with me twice within the next two months. Those meetings aim to strategize ways to achieve our goals of making United an inclusive worshipping community by blanketing the complexes near the church with invitations to join us in worship and for other church-related activities.

The outcome of the first meeting should produce an outline that clearly identifies activities and establishes a realistic timetable for implementing the agreed-upon strategies. The second meeting should conclude with a slimmeddown working document ready for implementation and promises from individuals to share the division of labor.

Beginning October 1, look for meeting dates and times. You will receive the information via email, text message, and phone calls. I hope you will say yes to joining the endeavor to continue growing our presence in the community by showing God's love.

Now, let me update you on the latest UPC mission outreach projects, including the Helping Homeless Families Initiative (HHFI). In September, on behalf of the congregation, friends of United donated one hundred school kits to El Centro's back-to-school festival. The kits contained one box of 12-count colored pencils, one box of 24-count crayons, one eraser, two # 2 pencils, a pencil case, and one 2-pocket homework folder (pictures of the kits are included in this newsletter).

The congregation also completed the pledge to the HHFI by delivering one hundred baby bottles and more than 3,000 baby wipes (2,000 of the wipes were fragrant- free for sensitive skin use) to the Newark "Y," where the homeless shelter is located (see pictures in this newsletter).

Phase two of our HHFI involves collecting 1,000 new bath towels and washcloths for the shelter to distribute to residents. To participate, send donations to the church or drop them off on Mondays or Tuesdays between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm until November 15.

Friends may God's face continually shine upon us and guide us in ways to reflect His glory. In Jesus' mighty name, I pray, amen.

## NATIVE AMERICAN, INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S OR COLUMBUS DAY OCTOBER 10, 2022

NOTE: Indigenous People's Day 2022 is a state observance in 30 states and a state holiday in 3 states and I federal district.



Columbus Day celebrations in the United States – meant to honor the legacy of the man credited with "discovering" the New World. The earliest known Columbus Day celebration took place on Oct. 12, 1792, on the 300th anniversary of his landing. But since the 1990s, a growing number of states have begun to replace Columbus Day with Indigenous Peoples Day – a holiday meant to honor the culture and history of the people living in the Americas both before and after Columbus' arrival.

In the following Q&A, Susan C. Faircloth, an enrolled member of the Coharie Tribe of North Carolina and professor of education at Colorado State University, explains the history of Indigenous Peoples Day and what it means to American education.

## First, why is Columbus Day a problem?

For many Indigenous peoples, Columbus Day is a controversial holiday because Columbus is viewed not as a discoverer, but rather as a colonizer. His arrival led to the forceful taking of land and set the stage for widespread death and loss of Indigenous ways of life.

### When did Indigenous Peoples Day come about?

In 1990, South Dakota – currently the state with the third-largest population of Native Americans in the U.S. – became the first state to officially recognize Native Americans' Day, commonly referred to as Indigenous Peoples Day in other parts of the country.

## How does Indigenous Peoples Day change things?

Indigenous Peoples Day offers an opportunity for educators to rethink how they teach what some have characterized as a "sanitized" story of the arrival of Columbus. This version omits or downplays the devastating impact of Columbus' arrival on Indigenous peoples. Indigenous Peoples Day is an opportunity to reconcile tensions between these two perspectives.

Research has shown that many schools do not accurately represent Indigenous peoples when they teach history. I think this is true not only on Indigenous Peoples Day, but throughout the school year. Researchers have found that K-12 schools tend to teach about Native Americans as if they existed only in the past. By revising the curriculum to better reflect both past and current histories and stories of Native peoples, educators can more accurately teach students about their cultures, histories and traditions.


#### Has there been any pushback?

Yes, the shift from Columbus Day to Indigenous Peoples Day has met resistance from communities across the country. In 2021, parents in Parsippany, New Jersey, protested the local school board's decision to celebrate Indigenous Peoples Day in place of Columbus Day. Among other things, they cited lack of community input, failure to honor the legacy of Italian immigrants and the need for a "more balanced picture of Columbus." In response, the school board removed the names of all holidays from its calendar. Now the holidays are just referred to as "days off."

## Reformation Sunday (October 30, 2022)

Presbyterians celebrate the tradition that grounds their faith on Reformation Sunday. It is always the last Sunday in October, marking the occasion in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany.

November 1st was an important day for the selling and buying of indulgences known as All Saints Day on the church's calendar. The day before a German Monk named Martin Luther posted a list of 95 Theses – 95 reasons that he objected to this practice of selling indulgences. Along with other writings by Martin Luther, those 95 Reasons went viral.

Luther insisted that we are not forgiven because of anything we do – including the buying of

Indulgences or doing enough good work. *Instead, we are forgiven because of who God is.* We are loved and forgiven because God is full of grace and mercy.

His teachings and writings got Martin Luther kicked out of the church. But he didn't go alone. Others agreed with him, and after his death those who agreed with Luther became known as Lutherans and also as Protestants. Every Protestant church traces their roots back to this moment in history.

## Why Does Reformation Sunday Matter?

October 31st, 1517 was a long time ago. Why does it continue to matter and be remembered in our churches today?

### 1. Reformation Sunday gives us a chance to tell our story – a chance to remember.

We all have a family story – how we got to this point in history. Stories about parents and grandparents, about the things that have shaped our families over the years. Reformation Sunday is a day when we remember and re-tell the family stories of our faith. Stories about men and women who came before us and taught us about the faith. Stories about people who risked everything so that we would be able to gather and worship in the manner that we do.

#### 2. Reformation Sunday reminds us of the most important things.

Throughout the year we preach about many things in church. About how we live our daily lives, the choices we make, the habits of our faith. On Reformation Sunday we are brought back to the most important thing – the thing that compelled Luther and others to risk their lives.

On Reformation Sunday, we return to the core of our faith: God loved us first, and God continues to shower us with grace and mercy.

#### 3. Reformation Sunday challenges us to do better

Through re-telling our story and returning to the core of our faith, Reformation Sunday prods us to do better.


We are called to be more loving and grace-filled, because God was gracious and merciful to us. We are called to repent of the times that we have placed barriers that have kept others from hearing the Good News. We are called to remember that all that we are is a gift from God.

In the church in Wittenberg where Martin Luther preached, there is a wonderful painting. In it Luther stands in the pulpit on the right hand side, and the people stand on the left. In between people and the preacher is Christ on the cross. Reformation Sunday is a reminder that this is the bedrock of our faith – the grace and mercy given to us in Jesus Christ. Keeping the most important thing in the center of the picture is the only hope for for our faith and for this community that we call "church." *Happy Reformation Sunday!*



The Plainfield Grassroots CDC is happy to announce our new **Out of the Box** science club program starting in **February 2021**. In this ALL NEW STEM program, administered by Mad Science, students are introduced to science using hands-on, inquiry-based approach in a fun and entertaining way.

CDC The club meets virtually weekly, for 8 weeks. Class is open to children ages 8-13. Classes are offered strictly on a first-come, first-served basis. Kids learn about how wide a field science is. They can take a look at how Detectives catch the bad guys, how do 3-D movies work, and learn how the weatherman predicts the weather.



Registrations are handled directly through the <u>Mad Science website</u> on a first-come, first-served basis.




## A Mustard Seed Faith

**Theme:** Faith in God

**Object:** A Bible; mustard seeds; a plant

Scripture: Luke 17:5-10

Have you ever seen a mustard seed? (Pause.) The mustard seed is one of the smallest of all seeds. (Let kids pass around some mustard seeds so they can all see and feel the size.)



Some people think of faith when they think of mustard seeds. Faith is when we believe in God and His power.

• What do you know about why people use mustard seeds as a symbol of faith? The reason some people use mustard seeds as a symbol of faith is because of something Jesus said in the Bible.

(Open your Bible.) When Jesus' friends asked Him how they could have stronger faith, Jesus said, "If you had faith even as small as a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'May you be uprooted and be planted in the sea,' and it would obey you!"

Wow! (Hold up one mustard seed and look closely at it.) Jesus said that God is so powerful that if our faith is even as small as this little seed, then we can do incredible things with His power.

Maybe we should try that. (Place the plant in front of the children.) If Jesus said we could pray and ask God to move a tree from our front yard to the sea, then we need even smaller faith to just move this plant a little bit. (Invite kids to discuss whether they can do it. If some would like to try it, then decide on where they'd like to move the plant, and lead them in all saying prayers to move the plant.)

Jesus didn't say someone with the faith of the mustard seed can move trees to the sea so that a bunch of people would start uprooting trees. That wasn't His point. He was teaching us that it doesn't take a great faith for great things to happen. Why? Because what happens doesn't depend on us, but instead on God. God has the power to do anything, and God is *for* us so we can trust whatever He does.

#### PRAYER:

God, we ask for a mustard seed sized faith. Help us to believe and never doubt Your mighty power. In Jesus' name, amen.
