Thank you for purchasing this Spelling Choice Board Packet! On each board there are nine different activities. Five boards are included. That gives you 45 different activities for your students to practice their spelling words with! Boards are labeled A – E so you can keep up with which board you have already used.

To use: I like to punch these with a three-hole punch so students can keep them in their binders or spelling folders. Students list their words in the box on the right. This way, their words are on hand. No more flipping back and forth to their newsletter or craning necks to see the board! Students highlight the three activities they want to complete. They can work on these throughout the week in their spelling or word-work center. Included is a template for a word find as well as a secret code/word value page to be used with Boards A, D, and E.
