M1A2 SEP

The M1 Abrams Main Battle Tank

The M1 Abrams is a third-generation American main battle tank designed by Chrysler Defense (Now General Dynamics Land Systems) The M1 Abrams entered service in 1980 replacing the M60. The M1 has gone through several enhancements over the years. The M1A1 produced from 1986 to 1992 featured an up gunned M256 120MM smoothbore cannon and improved armor. The M1A2 was further improved with a commander's independent thermal viewer, improved weapons station, GPS and, full digital data bus. The M1A2 System Enhancement Package (SEP) added digital maps, Linux Communication systems, and an improved cooling system to help for the heat added by the additional computer systems.


The Kit

This kit is the Dragon 1/72 scale version of the M1A2 SEP Kit number 7495 which I had won from one of MMCL's meeting raffles. The box art on this kit is a photograph of our very own Bill Wise's Abrams tank. Unfortunately, the kit decals included are not of Bill's tank. I built up this kit using one of the three options included in the kit, a tank from the 1st Calvary Division in Iraq 2004. The kit included "rubber band" style tracks that took paint well, fit, and glued up fine with CA glue.


Construction

The kit builds up straight forward (for a Dragon kit). The detail for a kit of this scale I thought was pretty good. I did have part of the bustle rack break when snipping it off the sprue with a pair of Xuron cutters, after that I used a pair of Micro-Mark single edge cutters which I think work much better in this smaller scale.

I primmed the kit with Mr. Surfacer 1500 black and weighted it down with fishing weights glued in place with 5 minute epoxy. I painted the kit in a base color mixture of Tamya XF-2 (3 parts) X-59 (1 part) and X-57 (1 part). I weathered the kit in a lightened mixture of the base color and oil paints. I added antennas made from music wire and a bead of CA glue. The kit included decals worked well and went down easy with micro set/sol.



Primed the kit with Mr. Surfacer 1500 black, and weighted the kit with fishing sinkers and 5 minute expoxy.
