ACR is really all about *The Cars* that is a good place to start. We had a record of 24 different automobile brands registered. This is a modern

day record, as we usually see about 20 auto brands. Seventy cars were registered, with 64 starting the Grand Run on Saturday morning. Attrition took its toll, as 53 crossed the finish line in New Brighton. Plus 12 other cars took part in the pretours.

Even though we did not have any pre-1900 cars this year, the variety of antique autos was amazing! There were three Stanley steam cars (which tend to stop often for water) and a couple of Franklins, which never seem to run out of water. It's always fun to see Ronny Gardas on his 1912 Indian motorcycle. Many other brands from yesteryear joined us, including DeDion Bouton, REO, Columbia, Autocar, Mitchell, Stevens-Duryea, Le Zebre, St. Louis, and Brush. Just looking around makes me feel like a little kid in a candy store. I would love to have one of each!

Early Fords topped the entry list with 15 cars, plus seven later Fords on the pretours. The 10 Maxwell cars entered continued to extend the Maxwell reliability streak, as Maxwell drivers Bob Long and John Elliott both finished their 29th ACR.

The geographical diversity of drivers was also interesting, with drivers from 20 different states. We saw cars from as far south as Florida and Texas up to North Dakota, as far east as Connecticut and Pennsylvania, and west to Colorado. In addition, we welcomed John Biggs from England and Ross McTavish from Canada. This year, 69% of drivers live outside of Minnesota.

Perhaps the most important thing about the 29<sup>th</sup> Annual ACR was the 14 *First Timers* joining in the fun. Many of these cars and drivers loved the quiet country roads, the rural Minnesota countryside and the camaraderie of being with more than 60 like minded old car aficionados. Many of this year's First Timers will be joining us August of 2016 for the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary ACR. For some, the annual trip to New London, MN will become a habit (rather like the Board of Directors and the President ©.)

In summary, the challenge of driving a 100 year or older car 120 miles in a day is too much to resist for many of us who occasionally have grease under our fingernails and motor oil in our veins. That challenge inspires us to do our restoration and maintenance tasks well, and hope for a little good fortune for DNF insurance. Mark your calendars! See you next year.
